In the name of God, I Martha Crump
of the County and State aforesaid do sound and perfect Mind
and Memory, do make and Publish this my last will and Testament
hereby scrapping and making void all former Wills by me at
any time heretofore made:— And first, I direct that my body be
decently interred, and that my funeral be conducted in a manner
Corresponding with my estate and situation in life:—

And as to such worldly estate as it hath pleased God to
Entrust me with, I make the following disposition of, viz
First, I direct that all my debts and funeral expenses be paid
as soon after my decease as possible by my Executors

Secondly, I give and bequeath to my Grandson Joseph
Nathaniel that tract of land belonging to me, lying and being
adjoining the lands of Solomon Brown and John Smith it
being the same I purchased of Col. John Harnan and
conveyed from him to me by Deed, a more particular description
of which land is shown in said Deed— I also give
him one Rifle Gun and a feather bed & furniture

Thirdly I give and bequeath to my son John Crump and his
heirs the sum of One dollar

Fourthly— I give and bequeath to my son William Crump
and his heirs the sum of One dollar

Fifthly I give and bequeath to the lawful heirs of my daughter
Priscilla the sum of One dollar

Sixthly— I give and bequeath to the lawful heirs of my daughter
Maddox the sum of One dollar

Seventhly I give and bequeath to my Grand-daughter Judith
Maddox the sum of fifteen dollars

Eighthly— All the remaining Parts of my estate and effects I direct
I desire may be sold and disposed of by my Executors in the
usual manner by law directed upon the aforesaid relation
and the proceeds to be divided in the following manner
viz, — One fourth I give and bequeath to the heirs at
Law of Benton Drake who intermarried with my daughter
Patsy, there being four of them of the following names, Charles
Jillia Drake lately intermarried with Anna Gunter Tinsley

Drake, Martha Drake and Sally Benton Drake share and share
alike in said fourth Part— I also give and bequeath to my daughter
Patsy intermarried as I am informed to one Botkin her lawful
heir the sum of one dollar:— The remaining one fourth I give
and bequeath to my three daughters, Judith Bell, wife of Jonathan
Bell, Nancy Browder formerly the wife of Dennis Browder and
and Francis Warden, now a widow and residents of Kentucky
to them and their lawful heirs share and share alike

And lastly I do hereby make and ordain my friend Jonathan
Harrison Executor of this my last will and Testament. In witness
whereof I Martha Crump have to this my will written on one
sheet of paper, set my hand and seal this second day of July
in the year of our Lord One Thousand eight hundred and
thirty five 1835

publicly and declared by the above
named Martha Crump and for
her last will & Testament in the
presence of us, who have subscribed
our names as witnesses thereto in the presence
of said Testatrix and in the presence of
each other

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The foregoing last will & Testament of Martha Crump deceased
was duly exhibited in open Court and proved by the oath of
Attorn B Tith a subscribing witness thereto and ordered to be
recorded whereupon Jonathan Harrison the Executor therein
named appeared in open Court and at August Term 1835
and was duly qualified Les Thos Rayland C C C
