 Self for himself, his heirs, executors and assigns with agreement
 the said William Morgan to warrant said negro boy and his heirs
 against from all other person or persons whatsoever all the right
 title and claim and demand whatsoever of in or to the said
 negro and that the said William Morgan is now at this
 time placed in quiet and peaceable possession of said negro.

 Given under his hand and seal the 31st day of Dec^r 1799

Seventhly I Give to my Daughter Sarah all the rest of my
personally whatsover. Lastly I Appoint my son in law Nathaniel
Dixon to execute this my last Will and Testament in
witness whereof I set my hand and seal this 6th day of
Apr. 1796.

disposal in manner following I bequeath I leave unto
