In the name of God Amen! I Parish Corp of the County of Chatham and state of North Carolina being in a feeble state of body & health but in a poor and disporing state of mind, thanks be to God for the same, do make ordain and publish this my last will and testamant in the following manner to wit: I give my body to the earth from whence it came to be buried in decent Christian burial, not doubting but that I shall receive the same again in the morning of the resurrection. And I recommend my soul unto the hands of Almighty God who gave it, and as to my earthly goods and chattels I give and dispose of them in manner and form as hereinafter mentioned.

Item 1st. I lend to my beloved wife Elizabeth by one Sott of Land containing ninety acres which I purchased from William Atly, also other Sott of Land which I purchased from William Butrell, whereon the dwelling house I now live in stand also one other Sott of Land which I purchased from William Boylan containing fifty three acres all of which I lend to her during her natural life. I also lend to my beloved wife Elizabeth One third of my mills on Buckhorn Creek during her natural

I also lend my beloved wife Elizabeth five negro slaves to wit: Hardin, Oly, Hanny, Milly, and Tray. I also lend her my carriage and two mules and one sorrel mare, three cows and calves, ten head of sheep, ten head of hogs, one yoke of oxen and cart, and also all such household and kitchen furniture as she may think proper to keep accept such as shall be herein after disposed of. Also I lend my wife all such of the plantation tools as may be thought necessary to use on the farm, also one year's provision and one hundred dollars which I give her.

Item 2<sup>d</sup> I give and bequeath to my beloved son Henry Croft that part of a tract of land I purchased from George H. Shute not decided to Deborry Chapman, also twenty eight acres I purchased from Gabriel Atley it being part of the Temperance Sinton Lott, I also give my son Henry Croft all the land that is herein devised to my wife, at her death, also one negro slave named Sandy, one cow & calf, one sow and pigs, one bed and furniture and a rifle gun.

Item 3<sup>d</sup> I give and bequeath to my beloved daughter Elizabeth Croft two negro slaves named Mariah and Penny and their increase, I also give her one feather bed and furniture, also one trunk and a dressing table, I also give my daughter Elizabeth one yellow filly and a saddle and bridle.

Item 4<sup>th</sup> I give and bequeath to my beloved sons Williams Croft and Richard Croft each one third of my mills on Buckhorn Creek during the lifetime of my wife and at her death I give them the mills jointly to them both, I also give to my two sons Williams Croft & Richard Croft one acre of land on Beaver Dam Creek, it being an acre which I got from Seth Cotten, I also give my two sons Williams & Richard all that tract of land belonging to the mill tract, also the tract I purchased from Lepee Ausley except what I have conveyed to Williams Croft by Deed.

Item 5<sup>th</sup> It is my will that the balance of shall be sold and the proceeds to be equally divided between

my daughters, and it is my will that all my estate  
not bequeathed by this will shall be sold by my ex-  
ecutors and the proceeds thereof to be equally divided  
between my eight children.

Item 6<sup>th</sup>. It is also my wish that at the death of my  
wife, all the estate that shall remain with her at  
death shall be sold and equally divided between  
shear alike between my eight children, and it is  
my will that my children shall not be accountable  
to each other for any property that I have hitherto  
given or conveyed to them since they left  
me.

Item 7<sup>th</sup>. It is also my will that if my negroes  
are ~~left~~ to be sold should be purchased by the exec-  
utors, that my executors shall in that case not draw  
commission on the amount of the sale of the negroes.

And I hereby revoke and annul all former  
wills by me made.

And I hereby nominate and appoint my two  
sons Williams Clegg and Richard Clegg my executors  
to this my last will and testament. In witness

I, Abner Hatley of the County of Chatham  
and State of North Carolina, being in my sixty  
ninth year of age and in a low state of health  
but sound in mind and memory as usual, thank  
God for it, do make and ordain this my  
last will and testament, in manner and for  
as follows:

Item 1<sup>st</sup>. That all my just debt be paid.

Item 2<sup>nd</sup>. I give and bequeath unto my son Britton  
Hatley, five negroes, namely, Jacob, Ruffin, Eu-  
lancy, Tabby, and Elisha to him and his heirs for-  
ever.

Item 3<sup>rd</sup>. I give and bequeath unto my son Reddin  
Hatley four negroes, namely, Riney, Simeon, Eliz-  
abeth and Lewis (son of Mary); also my blacksmith's  
tools, with all the apparatus, thereunto belonging,  
to him and his heirs forever.

4<sup>th</sup> Item, I give and bequeath to my daughter Delpha  
Hatley, three negroes, namely, India, Andrew, Emily,  
Haywood, and Martha, to her and her heirs  
forever.

5<sup>th</sup> Item, I give and bequeath unto my daughter Cynthia  
Hatley, Five negroes, namely, Amy, Rile, Moriah  
Ruben, and Washington, also one sorrel mare and  
colt, two cows and calves, two pigs and pigs, to her &  
her heirs forever.

6<sup>th</sup> Item, I give and bequeath to my son John Hatley  
six negroes, namely, Reuben, Alley, Harvey, Henry  
Carroll, and Hillyard, to him and his heirs forever.

7<sup>th</sup> Item, I give and bequeath unto my son William  
Hatley, Five negroes, namely, Lucy, Eliza, Lewis  
(son of) & my Sidney and Jane, to him and his heirs from  
ever.

8<sup>th</sup> Item, I give and bequeath unto my three sons  
namely Britton Hatley, Redden Hatley and William  
Hatley, all my lands with certain reserves, hereafter  
mentioned, to them and their heirs forever.

9<sup>th</sup> Item, I give and bequeath unto my daughter  
Delpha Hatley, in addition to what I have heretofore  
given, one sorrel horse called Starling, two cows & calves  
two cows and pigs to her and her heirs forever.

10<sup>th</sup> Item, I give and bequeath unto my son William
