I John Williams of the County of Chatham attorney at law do make this my last Will and Testament as follows
First I direct that all my just debts be paid. Secondly I give to my dearly beloved Wife Philadelphia all the plantation wherein I dwell, and all my Lovers things belonging or owing. Also the following Negroes, Old Cato, Lavin, & Adams, Jack, David, Jim, Kate, Sam and Cassin and Jimmy for her natural life; also I give her four Cow Slaves
