 one head of hogs one spinning wheel one hat three chairs
 one corn six plates two axes two barrels I give to my son
 Sidney Hann one cow and calf one small pot I give to my
 son Edward Hann one pot one spiders one spinning wheel
 one bed ^{sheet} and furniture one chest one pitcher one ~~crucifix~~
 One water pail two pigeons one bread tray three bowls
 one plate one set of knives and forks two chairs one washing
 tub one set of cups and saucers and the tract of land
 on which I know live one half I have to be sold for the
 support of my children which are known with me by
 Tabitha Anna Sidney Edward and the balance of
 my property after paying off all my Just debts to be equally
 divided between ~~my~~ my four children, viz. Tabitha
 Anna Sidney and Edward and ~~my~~ hereby make and
 ordain my worthy friends Anna Hann and Maderson
 Cook my executors of this my last will and testament
 in witness whereof I the said Rachel Hann have
 to this my last will and testament set my hand and
 seal the day and date above written
 Rachel Hann
 Signed sealed published and declared
 by the said Rachel to be her last will

and all the rest of my children given under my hand
and seal this 1st day of March and in the year of our
Lord Jesus dominion 1832, A.D. I further ordain and

appoint my daughters Margaret Mc Innis
and Eloray Mc Innis Executors of this my last will and
Testament given under my hand & seal the day year first
written
