

The above Will of William Daffy and was duly proved at
Newmarket Term 1817 by the oath of W^d. Lightfoot Allen
Jones and Murdoch McHenry who were qualified to be
competent witnesses

I Rebecca Wilson of the County of Chatham in the
State of North Carolina Widow being weak and sick
of body but of sound & disposing mind and memory
calling to mind the uncertainty of life and the certainty
of death do think it prudent and necessary to make the
following disposition of such property as I am owner of by
this my last Will and Testament. First my Will is that
all my Just be paid by Executors to be hereafter named
And whereas the Negroes in my possession and clothing
and the increase in the possession of James Wilson and
Harry in the possession of my son John Wilson and
settled on some of my Children that is to say a bargain
of John McLeannan and my three oldest sons John
and James Wilson & my three other Children having no
share and title in any of the Negroes - It is my wish
and desire that my Children should all be provided
for as near alike as can be. And I earnestly recommend
to my three oldest sons James Wilson & the Executors
of my Grand daughter Sam Wilson McLeannan
to consent to make an equal division of the said Negroes

with my three children to wit: Elizabeth Borge
 Milcor and Rebecca Milcor. If such equal division
 be made of the said Negroes my Will is that my
 surviving children and my Grand daughter Jane
 McLenon shall all be entitled to equal shares of
 Lands of which I am seized and possessors. But
 my three eldest children James, Peter and the
 daughter of my said Grand daughter shall refuse to
 an equal division of the Negroes as aforesaid: My
 Will is that my other three children Elizabeth Borge
 Milcor and Rebecca Milcor shall be paid
 out of my Lands so as for them to take as good
 estate as those of my children & Grand daughter
 holding the ^{2d} Negroes - And if my Lands should
 be found more valuable than three fifths of the
 the surplus & residue to be equally divided amongst
 all my children and my said Grand daughter -
 And if it should be found advantageous to make
 sale of any or all of my Lands. I do hereby
 empower my Executors to do so & to make conveyance
 thereof to the purchasers. I give & bequeath to my
 George my daughter Rebecca and my Grand daughter
 Jane McLenon each a Feather Bed, Bedstead
 & Furniture - My Silver Bug (or Bankard) I give
 & bequeath to my son John Milcor. All my Silver
 and other small Silver plate I give to my daughter

Rebecca and my Grand daughter Jane McLenon
 to be equally divided between them. I do nominate & appoint
 my trusty Friends Thomas Macdill & Burdett McKingie
 to be Guardians of Daughter Rebecca and Grand daughter
 Jane McLenon and with them to take charge
 of their education and their property until they shall
 arrive at years of maturity. I give and bequeath to my
 daughter Rebecca my black hogging the Bather and
 have not given my son James a Bed. It is my Will
 that he shall have as much allowed him over and above
 his share and dividend as will purchase a Bed &
 Furniture for him. All my other property not herein
 bequeathed, I Will to be disposed of by my Executors at
 their discretion. Lastly I do nominate and appoint
 my four sons, John, Thomas, George & James Milcor
 James Peter, John Borge Junr, Burdett McKingie
 & Thomas Macdill to be executors of this my last Will
 and Testament: hereby making & making void all
 other Wills by me made and acknowledging this as
 my last Will & Testament. In witness whereof
 I the said Rebecca Milcor have hereunto set my hand
 and seal the 31st day of August 1806. At New York.
 relating to Elizabeth Borge having paid Eighty pounds
 and the intentions made before the execution

Legna sealed published and
 declared by the Testator to be
 his last Will and Testament in

In the name of God amen I John Thompson
 of the County of Chatham do make and publish the following
 to be my last Will & Testament. My Will is the Tract
 Land of about One Hundred Acres whereon I now live
 shall on my death remain in the possession of my wife
 to her use and benefit for and during her life for the purpose
 of maintaining, ^{her} raising and educating my children
 while they are single and may remain with her. —
 I also leave to my loving wife during her life my Slave
 Negroes to wit a Girl named Dian and a Man
 named Jack — during her life — I also give to my wife
 all the Horses, Cattle, Hogs & Stock of every kind that
 I may possess or own at my death — Also all the crops
 and provisions that may be on hand — all the household
 and Kitchen Furniture and Farming utensils. —
 My Will further is that I give the child of my daughter
