Proven August 23rd 1866
by the oath of William Wadson

In the name of God amen. I Robert Parker
of the County of Chatham and State of North Carolina being
very sick and weak but in perfect mind and memory
thanked be given unto God, calling unto mind the mortality
of my body and knowing that it is appointed for all men
once to die, do make and ordain this my last Will and
Testament, that is to say principally and first of all
I give and recommend my soul unto the hands of almighty
God that gave it, and my body I recommend to the
earth to be buried in decent Christian burial at the
direction of my executors, putting a doubting but at the
general resurrection I shall receive the same again by the
mighty power of God; And as touching such worldly
estate wherewith it has pleased God to bless me in
this life, I give, devise & dispose of in the following
manner and form

First. I give to my beloved Wife Sarah Parker the
plantation which I now live on and one Negro Slave
by the name of Lewis and one Negro woman by the
name of Kate, also one Negro Girl by the name of
Lizzy, and one by the name of Jack, with them by the
name of Francis. Two Cows & Cattle, her choice out of
my stock of Cattle, and six head of Sheep, her choice
out of my stock of Sheep likewise all my Household

furniture exclusive of four feather Beds & Furniture
 likewise all my plantation utensils; likewise Twenty
 head of Hogs, two choice out of my stock of Hogs
 likewise all my flock of Geese the same to be hers
 during her life in Mien Seco & to possess them free and
 from any incumbrance whatever and after her death or
 marriage to be disposed of among my Children as is
 after named. Also I give to my well beloved son John
 Parker one tract of Land on the Bank of New Hope Creek
 at the mouth of a Gut at the Buffalo Ford on said
 Creek, running West to said John Parker's corner
 Tree a New Oak and thence a follow on the West
 end by said Parker's line, on the North side by Isaac
 Horn's and to Stuart Heston's down to said Creek then
 down the main course of said Creek to the beginning
 Also I give to him one Negro Man by the name of
 Lewis at the death or marriage of my beloved wife
 Sarah Parker.

Also I give to my beloved daughter Polly Parker one
 Negro Girl by the name of Lissy likewise one Feather Bed
 and Furniture, which was above excluded likewise one Chest
 and one Woman's Saddle. Also I give unto my beloved son
 Allen Parker the balance of my Tract of Land exclusive
 of Twenty five Acres, and that Twenty five Acres to be
 included the House and plantation whereon I now
 live, likewise one Black Slave if she get over her
 her full time and if she dies to have the Leopard Cat
 also one Man's Saddle and one Bed & Furniture as
 was above excluded, likewise one Cow & Calf.

Also I give to my beloved daughter Elizabeth Parker
one Negro Boy by the name of Jack, likewise one Bed
and Furniture that was a bed included also one chest
and one Woman's saddle. Also I give to my beloved son
Robert Parker Family Goods of Land including the place
whereupon I now live one Point Bell by the name of
Diamond, likewise one Feather Bed Furniture that was
a bed included also one cow and calf and one horse
saddle and at the death or marriage of my beloved
Wife Sarah the Negro Woman, boy and her increase
from the date hereof to be equally divided between my
son. Allen Parker and my son Robert Parker. Also at
the death or marriage of my beloved wife Sarah her
part of my estate to be sold and the money equally
divided between my daughter Polly Parker and
my son. Allen Parker and my daughter Elizabeth
Parker and my son Robert Parker. Also I make
ordain and constitute as my sole and sole executors
my well beloved wife Sarah and my dearly beloved
son John Parker of this my last Will and Testament
by them fully to be possessed and enjoyed, and I do
hereby utterly disallow by me in any way before named
Will and Testament ratifying and confirming this and
no other to be my last Will and Testament. In witness
whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal this
day of Decr in the year of our Lord one thousand eight
hundred and four. Signed sealed delivered published & pro-
nounced by the said John Parker as his last Will & Testament
in the presence of us six the presence of each other have hereunto
subscribed our names
