Salvador of the County of Chatham and State of North
Carolina, being weak in body but sound in mind blessed
be almighty God for his merits, do make constitute & appoint
this my last Will and Testament. In the first place my
Will and desire is that my loving and beloved Wife Sarah
shall have two third parts of the Plantation or Tract of
Land whereon Snow, which tract contains about Four Hun-
dred and Twenty Acres, which two thirds I desire shall
be taken off at the lower side according to the acres with-
out any regard being had to the value of the Land
which Land I desire she may have during her natural
life for the support and maintenance of my younger
Children, so long as they may remain with her. I also
give to my Wife Sarah my Saddle Horse called Doll
four year old last Spring, and one Saddle Horse
one Plough & Hears, two Cows & Calves, in choice of the
the Loom, a washing Miler, the Dutch Oven, two Pots
two Flax Wheels and one Cotton Wheel three Beds, Bed-
steads & Furniture, the Dishes and Furniture, the Crock
of crockery, two Smoothing Irons, two Washing Tubs &
two Pails, one Bath, six Chairs, one Churn, all which
said articles (except the Land) my said Wife Sarah is
to keep during her natural life, and use them as her
own, except that she is not to sell or any way dispose
of them; and at her death I desire that they may
be equally divided amongst all my Children or the

of any such as may become. I give my son John
lower Plantation or being the same & the Slaughter of Cows
Williams, and that Eli Johnston now lives on together with
that proportion of the thirds of Mr. Hannah Thompson's
his estate which I am indebted to, and also one half of
my Saw Mill, and my Saddle Horse called Buck three
year old last Spring, with a Saddle Horse, Plough
one Plough and Hears, one cow, one steatook, also one
Bed, Bedstead and Furniture. I give to my son Min
the third of the tract of Land now live on, the tract
containing about Four hundred & Twenty Acres, which
third is to be taken off at the upper adjoining Stephen
White, according to the number of Acres, without regard to
the value, one half the Saw Mill, my Saddle Horse called
Dick, four year old last Spring, one Plough
Hears, one Saddle Horse and Plough, one cow, one
steatook, one Bed, Bedstead & Furniture. I give to my
son Thomas two thirds of the third of Land whereon
I now live (which has been before divided to my Wife Sarah
after the death of my said Wife, also one hundred Dollars
to pay him when he comes of age or marries, whichever
may first happen. And whereas my two Daughters
married to Russell Dorsett and Niziah married to David
Hester, have each of them to receive about the sum of one
hundred and Twenty Dollars; my Will and desire is that
each of my daughters now single, that is to say Polly, the
Sally, Ann & William, shall have the sum of one hundred

308 and Twenty dollar; and if it shall so happen that my
Personal property estate is not sufficient to pay all my debts
and demands upon me and the legacies herein before
Willen, my desire that my said son John and William shall
pay equally to my three single daughters any deficiency in
their said legacies, which may not exceed the sum of eight
dollar to each daughter; if the deficiency be greater they
shall pay eighty and no more, and it is my desire that
whatever sum the said John and William may have to pay
the same shall be due to each girl at her age of Eighteen
or marriage whichever shall first happen. And I hereby
Revoke all, and all manner of Wills which may heretofore
have been made, hereby declaring this to be my last Will
and Testament. In testimony whereof, I have hereunto
set my hand & affixed my seal, this twenty seventh
day of October in the year of our Lord One thousand
eight hundred & twenty seven. I do constitute and appoint
my son Calhoun and my son in law Rufus Donnell
Executors to this my last Will and Testament the same
day & year
