one hundred acres of land joining James Burns land on  
the East end including the plantation that he now tenures  
also one House & Garage which he has had one Cow  
& Calf, one Bed Furniture when he settles. —

I give and bequeath unto my son Richard Patherhall  
one hundred acres of Land, lying West of his brother  
Benjamin's land and joining James Burnley's land  
also one House Garage when he comes of age & one Cow &  
Calf one Bed Furniture when goes to House keeping &  
all my Doctor Books & one Rifle Gun. —

I give & bequeath to my son Alexander Patherhall two  
hundred Acres of Land at the death of his Mother  
also one House Garage, one Cow & Calf, one Bed &  
Furniture when he settles. I give and bequeath unto  
my daughter Rebekah Lazarus, one Negro Girl called  
Isabel after the death of her Mother, also one Cow &  
Furniture, one Cow & Calf which she has had.

I give and bequeath to my daughter Polly Patherhall  
one Negro Woman called Sue at her Mother's death  
one Slave Garage which she claims, one Cow & Calf  
one Bed Furniture when she settles. —

My mind is that the Four Hundred & Ninety five  
Dollars that is in the hands of Mr John Ramsey  
may go to Purchase a Negro Boy, otherwise to go on  
Purchase the Boy to continue on the plantation with  
my wife until her decease then after her death

all the property in the possession not given away may  
be divided or sold among equally between my Chil-  
dren, John Benjamin, Rebekah, William, Polly, Sarah,  
and Alexander. — And I do hereby appoint and ordain  
my son John Patherhall, and my Grandson Thomas 1653  
Executor of this my last Will and Testament hereby revoking  
all other Wills. In witness whereof the said William  
Patherhall have set my Hand & Seal this the Ninth day of  
October the thousand Eight Hundred & Eighteen —

being sick & infirm of Body, but of sound mind and  
memory, recollecting that I much desire to prevent disputes  
with my brothers & sisters, after my death respecting my  
Property. I do make this Will, declaring it to be my last  
Will and Testament in the following manner. I. I will

Silk Shawl, Beaver Hat, Four Pairs of Stockings, One  
Bread, Tea steace and Curtains, two pair of Sheets, two  
Beaco Quilts, two Pillar Cases, two Chest tables, Two  
Table Pictures, two Books to her other Hous favor  
5<sup>t</sup> I give to Sally Anna Caroline Chapman Elizabeth  
Anthonia Chapman, Abnerine Adeline, Frances Chapman  
equally to be divided between these three Sisters, daughter  
of Susannah Chapman, the following Property (to wit)  
Three Negre Boys by the name of George, Solomon  
Hancy and all the remaining part of my weareing appur-  
that is not otherwise given away to them and their  
Heirs forever. 6<sup>t</sup> I give to Richard Buchanan son  
of Abner Buchanan, my Bay Horse to him the same  
forever 7<sup>t</sup> I give Joseph Buchanan son of Abner  
one Negre Boy by the name of Peter and my self  
to him his Heirs forever. 8<sup>t</sup> I give to Ruthie Dickins  
daughter of Abner Buchanan all of my Crop Hogs,  
Hats, Sadal O'Briels and Two of my Grocks that  
is to say, one dark groundad Calico one, and one  
white Yullard one to her other Hous favor —  
9<sup>t</sup> And further my Will is that after the death of my  
Mother Elizabeth Buchanan the Negre Boy Peter  
which I left to my mother Elizabeth Buchanan.
