One hundred acres of Land joining James Burns land, at
the East end including the plantation that he now tines
also One Negro & Slave, which he has had, one Cow
& Calf, one Bed Furniture when he settles. —

I Give and bequeath unto my Son Isaac Patterhale
One hundred acres of Land, lying West of his brother
Benjamin's land and joining James Mantley's land
also one Negro Slave when he comes of age 1 Cow &
Calf one Bed Furniture when goes to House keeping &
all my Doctor Books &c. &c. &c. —

I Give & bequeath to my Son Alexander Patterhale two
hundred acres of Land, at the death of his Mother
also one Negro Slave, one Cow & Calf, one Bed &
Furniture when he settles. — I Give and bequeath unto
my daughter Rebecca Lister, one Negro Girl called
Fidel after the death of her Mother, also one Cow &
Furniture, one Cow & Calf which she has had. —

I Give and bequeath to my daughter Polly Patterhale
one Negro Woman called Susan at her Mother's death
one Negro Slave which she claims, one Cow & Calf
one Bed Furniture when she settles. —

My will is that the Four hundred & Ninety five
Dollars that is in the hands of Mr John Ramsey
may go to Purchase a Negro Boy, otherwise to go on
Interest the Boy to continue on the plantation with
my wife until her decease then after her death

all the property in her possession not given away may
be divided or sold and divided equally between my Chil-
dren, John Benjamin, Rebecca, William, Polly, Pharah
and Alexander. — And I do hereby appoint and name
my Son John Patterhale, and my Grand Son William Lister
Executors of this my last Will and Testament hereby revoking
all other Wills. In witness whereof I the said William
Patterhale have set my hand & Seal this the ninth day of
October the thousand Eight hundred & Eighteen

being Sick & Infirm of Body, but of Sound mind and
memory, recollecting that I must die, &c. I do hereby dispose
with my brothers Winters, after my death respecting my
Property. I do make this Will, declaring it to be my last
Will and Testament in the following manner. I. I will
that all my Just debts be Paid. 2^d I Give to my beloved
Mother, Elizabeth Buchanan, five hundred Dollars
in money, & so much of my wearing apparel as she may
think proper to take; and I do give to her during her
natural life the certain Negro Boy called Thomas
the name of Lewis

12) 3^d I give to my Brother May Buchanan five hundred
dollars in Money 4th I give to Sally, Anna Caroline Chap-
man daughter of Susannah Chapman all my Linens & one
Negro Girl called Minnie by the name of Miley and
Sum of my Chout Grocks. I give of my Furs Capes my
best Shawl, Beaver Hat, five pair of Stockings, one
Braid, Bra stee and Curtains, two pair of Shirts, two
Braid Garters, two Silver Cases, two Christ tidels, two
Table Tidels, two Books to her Sister Fanny Farrow

5th I give to Sally Anna Caroline Chapman, Elizabeth
Annetten Chapman, Miriam Adeline, Francis Chapman
equally to be divided between these three sisters, daughter
of Susannah Chapman, the following Property (to wit)
Three Negro Boys by the name of George, Solomon
& Nancy and all the remaining part of my wearing apparel
that is not otherwise given away, to them and their
Sister Farrow 6th I give to Richard Buchanan son
of Abner Buchanan, my Bay Mare to him & his Sister
Farrow 7th I give Joseph Buchanan son of Abner
one Negro Boy by the name of Peter and my Coll
to him & his Sister Farrow. 8th I give to Ruth Dickson
daughter of Abner Buchanan all of my Crop Hogg
& Cattle, Saddle & Bridle and two of my Grocks that
is to say, one dark grounda called one, and one
white called one to her & her Sister Farrow.

9th And further my Will is that after the death of my
Mother Elizabeth Buchanan, the Negro Boy Lewis
which I lent to my mother Elizabeth Buchanans.

shall be equally divided between the three Daughters
of Susanah Chapman, also all the remaining part of
the Money which shall not be otherwise given away to them
and Wm's heirs forever 10th I give to Sally Carliss Six
dollars in money 11th I give to Martha Buchannon, daugh-
ter of Joseph Buchannon, the sum of Six dollars in money
12th I give to Patsy Buchannon daughter of Abram
Buchannon the sum of Six dollars in money
13th I appoint my Executors Archelaus Carliss & Fletcher
Drake my executors to this my last will and Testament
