

I Stephen White of the State of New Hampshire County of Rockingham
in health both of body and mind yet declining on the threshold of life and
the certainty of death and being desirous of settling my worldly
concerns do make my last Will and Testament in manner as follows
First, after my death and paid I give and bequeath to my wife Mary during
life or widowhood the old plantation which I now live including all
the buildings now in my possession on the old premises above named
also the third in all the land in my claim

Secondly I give and bequeath to my wife Mary all my stock of every
kind together with my moveable property farming utensils house hold
furniture &c — Thirdly my son Thomas White having paid his portion
I give and bequeath to him one dollar

Fourthly my daughter Fael Thompson having had her portion I
give and bequeath to her one dollar

Fifthly I give and bequeath to my son Ira C. White one hundred acres
of land beginning on Thomas corner on a black gum running west
one hundred and ten poles thence south forty poles to a black gum thence east
twenty poles to a white oak thence south fifty five degrees East twelve
poles thence fifteen degrees North forty four poles to a post oak thence
south one hundred and eighty six poles to a black oak thence West
twenty poles to a black oak thence South twenty five poles to a black oak
thence East twenty eight poles to a post oak thence North two hundred and
thirty poles to a black oak thence South two hundred and thirty poles to a black oak
thence North one pole to the beginning

Sixthly I give and bequeath to my son Eliam White one hundred acres
of land beginning on Ira C. White corner running west forty four poles to a
white oak thence south two hundred and fifteen poles to a post oak
thence East twenty four poles to a post oak thence North along the line to the beginning

Seventhly I give and bequeath to my daughter Maria Gray and her heirs
lawfully begotten of her body one hundred acres of land on the back branch
waters of the creek beginning on a Sassafras corner running west

Two hundred and four poles to a post oak thence North eighty four poles to a black
oak thence East two hundred and ten poles thence South to the beginning
Eighty I give and bequeath to my daughter Juliana Bartlett and her heirs law-
fully begotten of her body one hundred and twenty seven poles of land which twelve
acres shall be taken off that tract or part of land which was surveyed
for my daughter Elmina F. White in about square form adjoining where
Haywood Bartlett first commenced digging a well beginning at said corner
line running running West two hundred and ten poles to a black oak thence
Eighty poles to a black oak thence North to the beginning

Eighthly I give and bequeath to my daughter Elmina F. White and her
heirs lawfully begotten of her body one hundred acres of land beginning on
Haywood Bartlett corner and running west Two hundred and ten poles
thence North eight poles to a post oak thence East one pole to a
white oak thence North one hundred poles thence East to Ira C.
White's line thence along his line George Thompson's land to the beginning

Ninthly I give and bequeath to my son John C. White one hundred
acres including the old plantation with all the buildings and
improvements and of which he took care of me and his mother during
our life time my Will is that he shall have the whole of the land
that remains clear and above that which is not mentioned in this
Will but if he should die or fail in his care of my nephew his
mother all that remains clear one hundred acres shall be above
mentioned shall be equally divided between my son Eliam White
and Maria Gray but this shall not be so construed as to deprive my
son John C. White of any other part but that which from my
daughter Elmina F. White's land and shall be left open in
East and West direction without regard to the middle of the line
Eleventhly I appoint my son Eliam White and John C. White my Executors
to this my last Will and I have hereby renounced all claim of blood against
my son Ira C. White as my deceased
Twelfthly my household furniture and all the land of my estate and
my clothes together with my stock of every kind except the land above

Sold and the Money Shall be equally divided between my four daughters The Dusk I will to Julia Bartlett

Thertuntly I do hereby ratify and confirm this to be my last Will and Testament and I do rescind and make void all former wills and Testaments.

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The foregoing last will & Testament of Stephen White was duly exhibited in open Court at November Sessions 1829 and was proved by the Oaths of Warren Brooks & John P. Smith subscribing witnesses thereto and was ordered to be recorded whereupon John & White & Hiram White the Executors mentioned in said Will appeared in open Court and were duly qualified as such

In the Name of God amen I Thomas Cole of the County of Chatham and State of North Carolina being in a low State of health but perfect in mind and memory thank, the Good calling into mind the Mortality of my own body. Knowing that it appointed for all men once to die, do make & ordain this my last Will and Testament that I do hereby principally and first I give I give & Recommend my soul into hands of Almighty God that gave it, and my to the earth to be buried in decent Christian burial at the discretion of my Executors hoping to Rejoin the same in the Resurrection of the dead — As to my worldly Estate wherein it hath been pleased God to bless me with. I give devise and dispose of in the following manner
