the County of Chatham and State of North Carolina,
being of sound mind and Memory, and considering
the uncertainty of this frail and transitory life
do therefore, ordain, Publish, and declare this to be
my last Will and Testament: That is to say first
after all lawfull debts are paid und discharged
The residue of my estate real and personal I give
bequeath and dispose of as follows I wit: to my
son Thomas Workman forty acres of land where
he now lives, beginning at the white oak Spring running
South between the other two Springs opposite Son Maf
of woods thence West to the Knaf, thence South
far enough to get the forty acres by coming east
to John Strouds line, to him and his heirs forever
to my Daughter Sally Crow, and her lawfull
heirs forty acres of land, beginning at the Poplar
Spring running up the hollow to the line of the
heirs of Martha Patterson to a hickory blowed up
thence north to a white oak thence east far enough
to get the forty acres by turning South to Samuel
Baldwins line, thence West course back to the Poplar
Spring, The balance of this Tract I also give
to my Daughter Sally her lifetime should she
die without a lawfull heir of her body, then what
I have willed to her, is to be equally divided between
my son Thomas Workman, Nancy Lewis, Selvy
Williams and Elizabeth Hargers' heirs, to them
and their heirs forever, to my Daughter Nancy
and the lawfull heirs of her body, a portion of
land joining Samuel Baldwin beginning at his
corner running South to a hickory corner
thence ~~South~~ to a black oak thence north
opposite Baldwins corner, thence West

to that corner. To my Daughter Silvy Williams
 the tract of land lying on Collins Creek known
 as the Stanford Mill tract, to her and her
 heirs. Ten acres of this tract on the south east
 corner I give to her son Thomas. Likewise
 I make, constitute, and appoint Calvin Williams

 will and testament hereby revoking all former
