 First I will that all my Just debts be satisfied and Exp of interment paid out of my estate I will that my said heirs have the tract of land that I now live on with all the appurtenances thereto containing one hundred Acres be the same be as before this is bounded on the west by Enoch Williams land on the east by his own land All the grain & provisions to be divided equally between Nathan & Enoch I will that Nathan have My Hare I will that Enoch have My horse I will that Nathan have My Cow I will that Enoch have My geese & hares I will that Nathan have one feather bed & a shawl I will that Enoch have one feather bed & a shawl I will that my daughter Jane have two Corsets three blouses & three shawls I will that Nathan have My Saddle I will that Enoch have My Saddlebag I will that Nathan have My table I will that Enoch have My Chair I will that Nathan have My large pot I will that Enoch have My kettle & small pot I will that Nathan have one pewter dish & one basin I will that Enoch have six pewter plates I will to Nathan one iron pot each I will to Enoch one pistol I will to Nathan one plow & two plow shares I will to Enoch one cutting Hoe & knife I will that the balance of my property be equally divided between my two sons Nathan & Enoch Williams

In the Name of god Amen I Thomas Powell of the County of Kent - Hampshire and State of North Carolina being weak of body but of sound Mind and Memory and calling to Mind the Mortality of my body and knowing it is Appointed for all Men here to die do make and Ordain this my last will and testament and as touching my worldly goods which it hath pleased god to bless me with I dispose of in the following manner
 My will is first of all my Just debts shall be paid
 Then I bid state my beloved wife Nancy Powell during her life time My land and plantation all my stock of horses cattle hogs plantation working tools all my house hold and kitchen furniture and crop of all kinds My will is that after my wife's death that all my estate be equally divided between my two sons Namely Wiley Powell & Henry Powell My will further is that after my wife's death that my two grand daughters Nancy & Maria Kinship Poorman have each one half appearing if any such should remain in the said stock My will further is that my executor give one dollar to the lawful heirs of my daughter Sarah Poorman Jan de I Monrovia My two sons Wiley & Henry Powell My executor to this my last will & testament and revoke all former wills by me made in witness whereof the said Thomas Powell hath set his hand and seal this the 2^d day March 1814 signed and Acknowledged this his last will and testament in presence of us

I do it remembered that Thomas Dixon of Chatham County State of North
 Carolina being sick and weak in body and of perfect and sound
 memory calling to mind the Mortality of my body knowing that it is
 appointed for all Men Once to die do make and ordain this my last
 will and testament in Shannur and form following
 first I order that my funeral and just debts be paid out of my
 estate the remainder of which I will and bequeath in the following
 Manner To My son Jesse Dixon I give and bequeath twenty acres
 of land on which he now lives be it mine or left to him and
 his heirs forever Also to My son Jesse Dixon I give and bequeath
 One hundred seven Acres and One third of an acre (called the
 Mountain land) to him and his heirs forever Also to My son Jesse
 Dixon I give and bequeath a part of my meadow beginning
 On the North Side of the Creek and at the bank of the
 race where a fence runs across the meadow to the creek and
 to cross the creek and to continue on the same direction of the
 fence till it strikes Benjamin Dixons line thence Along
 his line to the corner just below the Mill dam thence Along
 the creek close below the Mill dam to the bank of the Mill
 ditch thence down the bank of said ditch following
 the various windings thereof to the beginning to him and
 his heirs forever Also I give and bequeath to My son Jesse
 Dixon All my saw Mill irons — — —
 To My son Joseph Dixon I give and bequeath the remainder of the planta-
 tion that I now live on to him and his heirs forever Also I give and
 bequeath to My son Joseph Dixon one hundred and seven Acres
 and One third of an Acre of land (called the Mountain land)
 to him and his heirs forever Also I give and bequeath to My
 son Joseph Dixon One half of the grist Mill and one half
 the Mill race accounts belonging to him and his heirs forever —

To My son Simon Dixon I give and bequeath One hundred
and seven Acres and one third of an Acre of land to him and
his heirs forever Called the Mountain land Also to My son Simon
Dixon I give and bequeath One half of the great Mill and
one half of the ~~Wheats~~ three carts belonging to him and his heirs
forever the true ~~and~~ intent and meaning of the One hundred and
seven Acres and one third of what is called the Mountain land
bequeathed to each of My sons is that it be equally divided
Amongst them he it ~~shall~~ have a life -

To My daughter Eleoph¹²⁴ Dixon I give and bequeath One
hundred and seven Acres of land and furniture sufficient for her
subsistence to put it to use Also My will is that she may have household
furniture and cattle as to her - her equal with the rest of
her ~~sister~~ ^{daughters} To My wife Abigail Dixon I give in charge and for
her Use All the house hold furniture and to have privilege of the
house and in short All My other property Not bequeathed in
this will I leave in her care and for her Use while she lives
My widow and at her death or end of her widowhood I order
that it be sold at publick sale by My executor hereafter
named and All the Money arising therefrom to be equally
divided Among All My four daughters share and share alike
and I order My two sons Simon Dixon and Joseph Dixon furnish
My wife or widow with grain or Meal sufficient for her support
and that My son Joseph Dixon furnish her with hay
or fodder sufficient for her cattle I also order that neither of
My sons shall bring in any illegitimate Child to him
any of the property bequeathed in this will and if either
of My sons shall die without legal issue the property
bequeathed to him or them in this shall descend to the

Leaving me a Blessing that their last representation
lastly My Will and desire is that that you My dear
May live in love and with Brothers as brethren and
and in the fear of the Lord to the end of your days
farewell —

I Nominate constitute and appoint My sons Simeon
Simon Dixon & Joseph Dixon whole and sole executors
of this My last will and testament in witness whereof
I have set My hand and seal this Ninth day of
twelfth Month in the Year of our Lord One thousand
eight hundred and twenty three —
