order this to be my last Will and Testament in manner

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to be buried at the discretion of my executors hereafter mentioned
 Secondly. I leave my real Estate as followeth. I give
 to my son Charles Pritchard the Summa and Twenty acres
 more or less as my Deed calls for. Sum. I give to a young Hutter
 the Weaver, a kind of a new Article piece for his execution.
 Sum. I give to son Charles Pritchard a new mentioned new
 head of Cattle they and their increase. Sum. I give unto
 my Grand Son Edward Pritchard son of my son's son
 above mentioned one Bed and Furniture. Sum. I leave to
 my son Charles aforesaid, the Bed and Furniture also
 all my whole Stock of Hogs, they and all their increase
 also three Head of Sheep & their increase, also a Horse.
 Coll. Sum. I give to my daughter Elizabeth Coll. one
 Dollar. Sum. I give to my daughter Susanna Wood
 one Dollar. Sum. I give to my son Thomas Pritchard
 one Dollar. Sum. I give to my son Charles above mentioned
 all the rest of my worldly estate of what kind as equally
 sever it be &c. But all the property above mentioned
 in my Will is to be mine as long as I live and after my

in the year of our Lord 1814 I, Abraham Cook being in good
and sound memory thanks to God, but coming to mind
the uncertain state of transitory life and that all flesh

and annulling all other Will or Wills heretofore by me
