siderably ill & remained in that situation until
the Sunday immediately following (tenth) 18th September 1842
when he died in his own dwelling house

Testament in manner following

1st I Lends unto my beloved wife Mary
Mason during her natural lifetime the tract of
lands a which farm lies lying on the east side
of Ebenezer containing about eight hundred acres
I also lends her the following negro slaves
Black Cipe, Lake Brink Andrew Buffins
and Edith & also lends her five horses two
horses wagon & gear also five cows & calves, two
horses and one yoke open ands cart, also twelve
head sheep her choice also all of my stock of hogs
also all the corn fodder & oats on the premises together
with all my farming tools and all my bacon
and also my household and kitchen furniture also
give her two hundred dollars in cash

2nd I also lends unto to my beloved daughter Adine
Booth the tract of land which she now has also
two negro slaves Russell & violet during her natural
lifetime & after her decease to be equally divided
between her children namely William Marcom
Mary Bates & Henderson Marcom

this. I also give my beloved daughter Elizabeth Booth Three Hundred Dollars in Cash
fourth. It is also my will & desire that that part
of estate consisting of negroes, land & other property
not mentioned in this will to be equally divided
between William Mason John. & Mason Turner
Mason Elizabeth Booth wife of Mason & Berry
Mason to them and their heirs each to have & hold alike
It is also my will & desire that Nancy Booth have
equal share in the above mentioned property during
her natural lifetime and after her decease to be
equally divided between her children namely William
Mason, Mary Gates & Henderson Mason.

fifth. It is also my will and desire that after the
decease of my wife that all the property I left her to
her shall be equally divided between William Mason
John & Mason Turner Mason Elizabeth Booth wife
Mason & Berry Mason to them and their heirs forever
each to have & hold alike. It is also my will ordain
that Nancy Booth receive an equal share with the
above named children during her natural life time
and after her decease to be equally divided between her
children namely William Mason, Mary Gates & Henderson

Be it remembered that I William Stort of Chatham County and State of North Carolina being weak and sick in body but of sound and perfect mind and memory do make and administer my last Will and Testament in manner and form following viz, My will is that all my just debts, together with my funeral charges be paid out of my estate Secondly I will and bequeath unto my four sons (my grandsons) Simon William Joseph and Tracy all my lands to be divided in the following manner. The tract wherein I now live to be divided equally amongst them by number of acres and by lines running East and West about and South. Simon to have the south East lot. William the south west lot Joseph the North west lot and Tracy the north east lot. Also my other tract to be divided equally amongst them by lines running East and West. Simon to have the first lot on the south side William to have the second lot on the south side Joseph the third lot and Tracy the fourth lot or North side to hold to them the said Simon Stort William Stort Joseph Stort and Tracy Stort their heirs and
