 existence do make and declare thus my last will  
 and Testament in manner and form following that  
 is say first my Executor hereinafter named shall pro-  
 vide for my body a decent burial suitable to the wishes  
 of my relatives and friends and pay all funeral expen-  
 ses together with my just debts howsoever and to  
 whomsoever owing out of the moneys that may first  
 come into their hand as a part or parcel of my  
 Estate. Item I give and devise to my beloved wife  
 Anna Welch the tract of land that I now live on  
 containing about one hundred & eighty seven acres  
 be the same more or less to have & to hold during her  
 life time or widowhood but if my beloved wife Anna  
 Welch considers that she can better herself & children by  
 selling the land here & moving to some other place I then  
 authorize her to sell the premises and make title to  
 said land and it is to be as good and valid as tho I  
 were present and signed said title in either law or  
 equity. Item give to my beloved wife Anna Welch  
 my waggon three head of horses all my stock of  
 hogs and sheep all the stock of cattle all the plows  
 & gears all the head stead and furniture all the  
 chest block and loom and all the household and  
 kitchen furniture all the crop of corn and wheat &  
 all other crops that are on hand and all other  
 property belonging to me not named as well as if  
 named and lastly I do hereby constitute and  
 appoint my beloved wife Anna Welch my  
 & lawful Executor to all intents & purposes

to execute this my last will and Testament according to true intent and meaning of the same and every and clause thereof and that she as my Executrix is authorized to sell so much of the property within private or public as appears to pay all my just debts and that to be used properly as she can best spare and the balance to keep for the purpose of raising the children upon for them to be kept together and to help to support each other and for her to have the control of them until they become free by law for witness whereof I the said Wm Welch do hereunto set my hand and seal this 26<sup>th</sup> day of July 1849

Item 1<sup>st</sup> I give and devise to my daughter Martha Scott one hundred dollars to be paid by the executrix Item I give and devise to my youngest son Willis one young man to be valued at Thirty dollars also one hundred ~~acres~~ of land to commence at which ever corner of my land that he chooses to run the corner amount to be valued at two hundred dollars to have and to hold to him and his heirs in fee simple forever Item 3<sup>rd</sup> I give and devise to my youngest daughter Catharine one benevolence at ten dollars also one hundred acres of Land joining Willis's tract to be valued at two hundred dollars to have and to hold to her heirs in fee simple forever Item 4<sup>th</sup> I give and devise to my beloved wife Susan all the balance of my land, horses, cattle and hogs, corn & wheat and all other property and three hundred dollars in money to have and to hold or dispose of as she may prefer
