William Carl of the County of Chatham in the
State of North Carolina being of sound & disposing mind do
make and ordain this my last will and Testament first after
my decease that my body be decently interred and all my just
debts paid, I give & bequeath unto my beloved Wife Mary the
Hall a large Room of the house I now live in & Kitchen, also
the orchard and meadow, and the little field by the barn
& Privilege of what Center she may want for repairs and
other necessary use, and five head, the Cow her choice, the
gray horse, the Ewe Lamb, one half of my Stock of
her Chair, the Plough, one pair Rough Hairs, 1 Hat

the one, all the grain and Provision on hand and in the
 grounds together with that half of the Stock above mentioned
 for her use & support together with my daughter Ruth &
 her daughter Poley - all my Household furniture, or so much
 of it as may be judged necessary for the use of her & my
 daughter Ruth & her daughter Poley. All the above I give
 unto my beloved wife during her natural life or widowhood
 all the property she has & brought with her after I married
 her. I give & bequeath the same unto her & her heirs. I give &
 bequeath unto my daughter Ruth, one Cow, her choice, next
 after her Mother, one yearling, mare & colt, the use of the lower
 back kitchen & room. I give and bequeath unto my daughter
 Ruth, daughter Poley, one Cow named Lily. I will &
 bequeath unto my daughter Mary Twenty dollars. —
 I will and bequeath unto my son William Twenty dollars
 I will all my movable property except what I have above
 devised to be sold, & the two legacies above mentioned to be
 paid out of the proceeds of it, the balance to be equally
 divided amongst all my daughters, namely Hannah, Elizabeth
 Mary, Meriah & Ruth. It is my will and desire that my
 beloved wife should have a decent & sufficient support
 during her natural life or widowhood — Therefore for that purpose
 I give upon my sons, George, Benjamin, and James, each one
 to pay in proportion to the value of his share, hereafter will,
 to them a sum sufficient for her support, yearly, & that each
 of them shall yearly, cut a Hail to her House & fifteen
 Waggon Loads of Fire Wood — I give and bequeath
 unto my sons George and Benjamin, all that track and body

of Land they both now live on; the best branch, running thro'
 said track: I give and bequeath unto my son George, that is on the
 South side of said branch where he now lives — I give & bequeath
 unto my son Benjamin, that part on the North side of said
 of said branch, where he now lives, to them their heirs & assigns
 forever, each one Part to be value of they think necessary, repairs
 of the improvements thereon, and that one who it shall be
 thought to have the most valuable part exclusion of improvements
 shall pay to the other the sum that his part may be judged
 deficient in value. — I will and bequeath unto my son
 James All the land and Plantation where I now live, subject
 to the encumbrances before mentioned to him his heirs & assigns
 forever. I hereby appoint constitute and appoint my sons
 George and Benjamin my whole and sole Executors of this my
 last will and Testament hereby disavowing & revoking all
 others. I will further that if my said dear should marry
 & after her death, that the property will be to her for that time
 be sold or divided, that is to my daughter Ruth one third
 part, the other two thirds equally divided between all my
 other daughters. In witness whereof I have hereunto set my
 hand this 28th 1st mo. 1818.
