worldly Goods as I have placed God to bless me with I dispose of them
in the following manner to wit, I have I have the plantation whereon
I now live to my loving Wife & my Glasp containing by estimation
two hundred Acre during his natural life and at his death to my
son Thomas E. Glasp to him and his heirs forever. I have I have the
slave and use of my negroes that I have to my said Wife during
his natural life at his death to be equally divided between all my
Children. I have I have to my said Wife two of my Hens Toby and
the Black Hen and my stock of all kinds my Plantation and Smiths
Tools one Bed & furniture and all my household furniture at his
death to be equally between all my Children except the Beds which
Mary & Elizabeth having married their Beds are to have no part of
any more Beds. I have I give my Daughter Mary a negro Girl Genas
my own man after the Coll which she is with fold with is taken
of one saddle & Bridle one Bed which Bed saddle & Bridle and negro
Genas she is in possession of. I have I give to my son Stephen Glasp
my tract of land I bought of Lewis Ashman whom James Carter
now lives lying the north side Bear Creek containing one hundred
and five Acre and one hundred and thirty Acre lying on the
south side of said Creek between the Haw and Robins Branch
to him and his heirs forever. I have I give to my son John Glasp
my tract of land a rather part of a tract that I bought of Thomas
Younger containing one hundred and twenty Acre to him and
his heirs forever. I have I give to my two sons Stephen and John
Glasp my negro Buck & my saw mill for five years with the
privilege of timber on any part of the whole of my lands and

to them and their heirs forever. I have I give to my daughter Ellen

William Glap my tract of land lying between the Crooked
Branch and Hobbs Branch supposed to be three hundred acres
including sixty eight acres that I bought of Adam Shaver to him
and his heirs forever. I give to my son William Glap my negro boy
Jacob and my Eliza child to him and her heirs forever. I have I give
to my daughter Sarah Glap my negro girl Mary and a boy by the
name of Gilbert to her and her heirs forever. I have I give to daughter
Abigail my negro child to her and her heirs forever. I have I give
to my son Thomas Glap my negro boy Joseph to him and his heirs
forever. My will and desire is that my two sons Stephen and
John Glap pay the debt that I am owing with profits arising
from the Saw Mill & the profits arising from the running of the
I do appoint my son Stephen Glap, John Glap, James Carter & John
Martin Executors of this my last Will and Testament. In witness
