sensibly considering the shortness of life and certainty of death
do hereby make and ordain this my last Will and Tes-
tament in manner and form following hereby man-

ful debts are paid in the following manner to wit:
I give and bequeath to my beloved Wife all
the Negroes now in my possession and which I have not
already disposed of to her use and benefit until the death
of my four youngest Children come of age, to enable
her to raise and educate these four youngest Children
to wit: William George Washington Joseph John and
Charlotte Solastor to be equally between herself and
the four mentioned Children when the eldest shall come
of age. — I also give and bequeath to my beloved Wife
the whole of that Tract of Land situate in now live and
her devise to descend to my son George W. Solastor to him
and his heirs forever. Then I give and bequeath to sons
William Solastor and my son Sol. Jr. Solastor the tract
or parcel of Land called the River plantation to be equally
divided between them when the eldest come of age by my
executors. Item. It is my request that the Tract or
parcel of Land on King's adjoining Thomas Peat's
Land be sold and the proceeds divided equally between my
three youngest sons. — It is my Will I request that
my Executors dispose of and sell all the stock that
can be spared upon the plantation and that the value
and their increase go to the use and benefit of my
Wife during her natural life for the cause to be sold
and equally divide among my four youngest Children

Item. It is also my desire that my son, Geo. Millican
superintend the plantation and handle the ensuing year
as owner and as the expiration comes an equal share
of the Crop for himself and his hands.

Item. I give and bequeath to my Wife during her
life all my Household and Kitchen Furniture and
her dearest to be equally divided among all my
Children. Lastly, I hereby constitute my ^{executors} and trustees
Joseph, Geo. Allen John. Wilson my love son Thomas
Solomon & son in Law George Millican and
Abias Ramsey Executors to this my last Will
and Testament In witness whereof I have hereunto
set my hand and seal this 21st day of March 1808.
