State of North Carolina } I Joseph Allen do make and ordain this
Chatham County } my last Will & Testament in manner form
following to wit I leave to my wife Fanny Allen during her
life the land and plantation whereon I now live the land she shall
have at Liberty to sell that land by the consent of my two sons John
Allen and John M. Allen and John Farnor of Virginia who
entered into with my daughter Mary or any two of them who shall
and is authorized to convey all right and title to the land except
the grass yard where my Father and Mother buried with other of the
family which is one eighth of an acre lay off and bounded
as follows Beginning at a Post Oak running North to a Post there
West to a Post thence South to a Post thence East to the beginning
The money arising from said sale shall be lay out in the
purchase of land by my Executors for land where my wife
desires
