In the name of God Amen I William Moran of the County of  
Chatham and State of North Carolina being weak of body  
but of perfect mind and memory knowing that it is once ap-  
pointed for all men to die I make and ordain this my last  
will and Testament in manner and form as follows Viz  
I recommend my body to a decent burial and my soul  
to the God that gave it and as to what worldly goods it  
has pleased God to bless me with it is my desire they shall be  
disposed of in the following manner —

I will and bequeath to my beloved wife Delilah Moran  
all that tract or parcel of land whereon I now live during  
her Natural life and at her death to be divided between  
my Son William and John Moran as follows the Long  
Branch to be the line until it comes to the Meadow  
since then run with the Meadow fence a strait course  
thence the old field until it strikes <sup>this</sup> branch again then  
down said branch to the lower line the land lying  
on the east side of said branch I will and bequeath to  
my son William Moran after the death of his Mother

Delilah Moran to him and his forever, the land lying on the west side of said branch including the Meadow and Spring I will and bequeath to my son John Moran after the death of his Mother Delilah Moran to him and his heirs forever. It is also my will that my beloved wife Delilah Moran have one horse her choice of my stock of horses and also as much of my other stock and household & kitchen furniture as she may think sufficient for her use and it is further my will that after the death of my beloved wife Delilah Moran it is my desire the perishable property in which she may leave may be equally divided between my daughters then living if not their heirs big my daughter Mimmie Martin bloy Real Nancy Moran Mary Thomas & Patience Howard and in case of the death of either my daughter Patience Howard or Mary Thomas it is my will the property shall be inherited by their children —

It is also my will that my son John Moran have one cow & calf my wagon & gear one bed & furniture six gear —

It is also my will that my daughter Nancy have one bed and furniture six gear and twenty dollars to be paid to her out of the sale of my property that shall be exposed to sale —

It is also my will that my grand son McCajah Thomas have two Cows & one cow —

It is also my will that the Residue of my property of all descriptions be sold and the Money equally divided between my five daughters and in case of the death of either of them their heirs big Mimmie Martin bloy Real Nancy Moran Mary Thomas and Patience Howard and in case of the death of either of my daughters Patience

Howard or Mary Thomas the property going to either shall equally be inherited by their children — I leave my son William & John Moran executors to this my last will and Testament

In the Name of God Amen the 14th day of July 1830 I Sarah Kemp of the County of Chatham and State of North Carolina being weak in body but of sound and perfect mind and memory blessed be God therefore calling to mind the Mortality of my body and knowing it is appointed for all men once to die do make and ordain this my last will and Testament in Manner and form following that is to say my will is that my Just debts and funeral charges be paid. I also give and bequeath unto my beloved wife Sarah my two horses two cows and calves and all my stock of Hogs and sheep and all my farming tools household and kitchen furniture except one set of tea cups and saucers and one bottle which I give unto her while she remains my widow and I give and bequeath unto my wife Sarah one bed and furniture one loom and one side saddle and one Cotton wheel during her life time — I also will and bequeath unto my son Joseph one Rifle gun and <sup>my</sup> Bull Calf which I will and bequeath unto him his heirs and assigns forever I likewise will and bequeath unto my daughter Ruth one sheep half and one white bottle I will unto her her heirs and assigns forever
