In the name of God amen. I William Patward
of Chatham County & State of North Carolina being
of sound mind & memory, but poorly in body knowing
the uncertainty of life, do make & declare this my
last Will and Testament. First I recommend my
Soul to almighty God, and my body to be decently buried
hoping through the merits of Christ for a blessed resurrection
and as for what worldly property I shall possess

Lead to testify on me. I give and bequeth in the following
manner. (To wit) First I leave the use of the Land Plan-
tation, containing 1 Hundred Acres, where I now live and
situated lying on the South Side of Saico Land and crossing
Rocky River, with all the House & improvements thereon to
my beloved Wife Mary Paltshaw & also all my Negroes
Mumby, Silas, Ayable, Isaac and Wiley, and all my stock
of Hens, Cattle, Sheep & Hogs, and Fowls of every description
and all my House hold & Kitchen Furniture and my
Waggon & all my Plantation & other Tools, and all the crop
of every kind that may be on my Plantation at my decease
and the like, none of the said property to be sold by
the Sheriff, or any other person, all to be for the support
of my beloved Wife during her natural life, except the
property that may hereafter be given to my younger
Children. I give and bequeth to my son John Paltshaw
one Hundred Acres of Land, lying to the East of the tract
that I now live on, both sides of Rocky River, also one
Mare & foal, one Bed Furniture, all of which he has
got in possession, also one Cow and Calf at the death
of his Mother. I give & bequeth unto my son Benjamin
Paltshaw, one Hundred Acres of Land, on the South Side
of Rocky River, and West Side of John Williams land
that he bought of Abner Smith, where the said Benj is
now living, also one Mare & foal, one Cow & calf
one Bed Furniture, all of which he has in possession.

10 I Give and bequeath unto my Son William Patterhale
One Hunana Acres of Land joining James Burns Land, at
the East end including the plantation that he now tines
also One Horse & Wadale, which he has had, one Cow
& Calf, one Bed Furniture when he settles. —

I Give and bequeath unto my Son Alexander Patterhale
One Hunana Acres of Land, lying West of his brother
Benjamin's Land and joining James Mantley's Land
also one Horse Wadale when he comes of age & Cow &
Calf one Bed Furniture when goes to House keeping &
all my Doctor Books & one Bible &c. —

I Give & bequeath to my Son Alexander Patterhale two
Hunana Acres of Land, at the death of his Mother
also one Horse Wadale, One Cow & Calf, one Bed &
Furniture when he settles. — I Give and bequeath unto
my daughter Rebecca Loxley, one Negro Girl called
Isabel after the death of her Mother, also one bed &
Furniture, one Cow & Calf which she has had.

I Give and bequeath to my daughter Polly Patterhale
One Negro Woman called Susan at her Mother's death
one Horse Wadale which she claims, one Cow & Calf
one Bed Furniture when she settles. —

My will is that the Four Hunana & Ninety five
Dollars that is in the hands of Mr John Ramsey
may go to Purchase a Negro Boy, otherwise to go on
Interest the Boy to continue on the plantation with
my Wife until her decease then after her death

all the property in her possession not given away may
be divided or sold and divided equally between my Chil-
dren, John Benjamin, Rebecca, William, Polly, Pharah
and Alexander. — And I do hereby appoint and name
my Son John Patterhale, and my Grand Son William
Executor of this my last Will and Testament hereby revoking
all other Wills. In witness whereof I the said William
Patterhale have set my Hand & Seal this the Ninth day of
October the thousand Eight Hundred & Eighteen

being Sick & Infirm of Body, but of Sound mind and
memory, recollecting that I must die, & to prevent disputes
with my brothers & Sisters, after my death respecting my
Property, I do make this Will, declaring it to be my last
Will and Testament in the following manner. I. I will
that all my Just debts be Paid. 2^d I Give to my beloved
Mother, Elizabeth Buchanan, Five Hunana Dollars
in money, & so much of my wearing apparel as she may
think proper to take; and I also lend to her during her
natural life the certain Negro Boy called Thomas
the name of Lewis
