the uncertainty of life, do make & renew this my
last Will and Testament. First I recommend my
soul to a mighty God, and my body to be decently buried
hoping through the merits of Christ for a blessed immortality
and as for what earthly property it shall please

I give to her to bequeath on my decease
in manner (to-wit) First I give the use of the said Plan-
tation, containing 1 Hundred Acres, where I now live and
I have had lying on the South side of said Land and crossing
Rocky River, with all the Houss Improvements thereon to
my beloved Wife Mary Potts-hall & also all my Negroes
Nuny, Silo, Agabell, Jucar and Killy, and all my Stock
of Horses, Cattle, Sheep & Hogs, and Hounds of every description
and all my House Holes Kitchen Utensils and my
Waggon & all my Plantation Tools Tools, and all the rest
of every kind that may be on my Plantation at my decease
and the same, none of the said property to be sold by
the Sheriff, or any other person, all to be for the support
of my beloved Wife during her natural life, except the
proceeds that may hereafter be given to my younger
Children. I give and bequeath to my son John Potts-hall
one Hundred Acres of Land, lying to the East of the track
that I now lie on, back side of Rocky River, also one
Mare & Foal, one Bed Furniture, all of which he has
got in possession, also one Cow and Calf at the death
of his Mother. I give & bequeath unto my son Benjamin
Potts-hall, One Hundred Acres of Land, on the South side
of Rocky River, and West side of John Williams land
that he bought of Martin Smith, where the said Boy
now lies, also one Mare & Foal, one Cow & Calf
one Bed Furniture, all of which he has in possession.

16 I give and bequeath unto my son William Patherhall
one hundred acres of land joining James Burns land on
the East end including the plantation that he now tenures
also one House & Garage which he has had one Cow
& Calf, one Bed Furniture when he settles. —

I give and bequeath unto my son Richard Patherhall
one hundred acres of Land, lying West of his brother
Benjamin's land and joining James Burnley's land
also one House Garage when he comes of age & one Cow &
Calf one Bed Furniture when goes to House keeping &
all my Doctor Books & one Rifle Gun. —

I give & bequeath to my son Alexander Patherhall two
hundred Acres of Land at the death of his Mother
also one House Garage, one Cow & Calf, one Bed &
Furniture when he settles. I give and bequeath unto
my daughter Rebekah Lazarus, one Negro Girl called
Isabel after the death of her Mother, also one Cow &
Furniture, one Cow & Calf which she has had.

I give and bequeath to my daughter Polly Patherhall
one Negro Woman called Sue at her Mother's death
one Slave Garage which she claims, one Cow & Calf
one Bed Furniture when she settles. —

My mind is that the Four Hundred & Ninety five
Dollars that is in the hands of Mr John Ramsey
may go to Purchase a Negro Boy, otherwise to go on
Purchase the Boy to continue on the plantation with
my wife until her decease then after her death

all the property in the possession not given away may
be divided or sold among equally between my Chil-
dren, John Benjamin, Rebekah, William, Polly, Sarah,
and Alexander. — And I do hereby appoint and ordain
my son John Patherhall, and my Grandson Thomas 1653
Executor of this my last Will and Testament hereby revoking
all other Wills. In witness whereof the said William
Patherhall have set my Hand & Seal this the Ninth day of
October the thousand Eight Hundred & Eighteen —
