make, ordain, publish and declare this to be
my Last Will and Testament:

First: I will that my wife and my two
executors hereinafter named pay all my funeral
expenses after my death, together with all
my just debts, out of the first money coming
into their hands belonging to my estate;

Second: I give, devise and bequeath to my
beloved wife, Katherine Swan, during her natural
life, all the real estate and interest in real
estate and all the personal property of every
kind and description where-ever situated, of
which I may be seized and possessed at the
time of my death, and after her death, to my
beloved children, jointly, their heirs and
assigns in fee simple forever, share and
share alike.

Lastly: I hereby make, constitute and appoint
my friends, John E. Coburn and Robert B. Slaughter,
my lawful executors to all intent and purpose
to execute this my Last Will and Testament,
according to the true intent and meaning of
the same and every part and clause thereof.

Reposing full faith and confidence in the
integrity and business ability of my executors
above named to administer upon my estate,
it is my will and desire that they be
allowed to qualify as my executors
without giving the bond required by law.
