I direct that after my death my body be given a decent burial in accordance with the wishes of my wife and family, and that the expenses of my sickness and burial together with my just debts be paid out of my estate by my executors hereinafter named.

I devise to my beloved wife, Betta Clayton, for and during her natural life, all my property of every kind, real and personal.

After the death of my said wife I devise to my son, Eddy Clayton, the Braigmiles place containing 55 acres, part of Tract No 22 in District No 3, being described in a deed from J. M. Braigmiles to E. M. Clayton dated Aug 30, 1898, registered in Cherokee County in Deed Book No 5 page 491, to which reference is made, less a parcel sold to the Louisville & Nashville Railroad Company, about 4 acres, and about 22 acres sold to Walter Gibson, and about 1 acre sold to Frank Tate to deeds to whom made by me and my wife reference is made for proper description

After the death of my said wife I devise to my son, Stanley Clayton, 85 acres more or less, being part of Tracts No 27 and 31, in District No 3, described in a deed from W. J. Dobson and wife to E. M. Clayton, dated Sept. 4, 1917, registered in Cherokee County Oct 26, 1920, in Deed Book No 75 page 307 to which reference is made for proper description.

The remainder of my lands, consisting of about 56 acres (before mentioned by me) conveyed to me by L. F. Beal and wife by deed dated Feb. 22, 1904, Part of Tract No 23, see Deed Book No 13 p 289, and

The James L. Henry and Eliza A. Henry interest in Tract no 26, Dist 3, I hereby devise to my two daughters, Fannie Dockery and May Ellersburg, share and share alike, to take effect after the death of my said wife.

I direct that my Executor to turn over to my successor as guardian of Elfreda Solerbee about \$300.00 in cash on hand less expenses of \$40.00 or \$50.00 to be shown by my account; and certificate of deposit and checking account in the Lake Okeechobee Bank, as soon as such successor be legally appointed.

Shere by name and appoint my said two sons, Eddy Clayton and Stanley Clayton the Executors of this Will and direct that they be permitted to qualify and serve without bond being required of them in regard to my estate: hereby revoking any wills by me heretofore made.
