 but considering the uncertainty of
 my earthly existence, do make
 and declare this my last Will
 and testament:
 First My Executor hereinafter named
 shall give my body a decent
 burial, suitable to the wishes
 of my friends and relatives and
 pay all funeral expenses together
 with all of my just debts,
 out of the first moneys which
 may come into his hands
 belonging to my estate.

Second I give and bequeath to each one of my children the sum of \$1⁰⁰ Dollars in cash to be paid to them at my death by my executor hereinafter named as their part of my estate after the payment of all of my debts.

Third. I give and bequeath to my Grandchildren (whose fourth is dead who is or would be a lineal heir to my estate) the sum of \$1⁰⁰ Each - Dollars to be equally divided between them per capita as their part of my estate.

Fourth. I give and bequeath to children of Francis Fricks the sum of Dollars the sum of \$1⁰⁰ Each Dollars to be equally divided between them as their part of my estate.

Fifth. Whereas Francis Fricks has been very dutiful in the help of me and taking care of me in my old age and in the recognition of the said services rendered me by the said Francis Fricks, my son, I do here by bequeath and devise to him all of my property both real and personal that I may have at the date of my death which may be left after the payment of all my debts and the legacies set out and enumerated above as his part of my estate.

Sixth. That it is my will, and desire to remain with the said Francis Fricks, who will take care of me the balance of my days.

Fourth. I hereby constitute and appoint my trusted friend Sam Graves my lawful Executor to all intents and purposes to execute this my last Will and testament. All according to the true intent and meaning of the same, and every part and clause thereof - hereby resolving and declaring utterly void all other Wills and Testaments by me heretofore made.
