I, J. P. Dossary, of the aforesaid County and state being of sound mind but questioning the uncertainty of my earthly existence, do make and declare this my last will and testament:

First I give and devise hereinafter named shall give my body a decent burial suitable to the wishes of my friends and relatives, and pay all my funeral expenses together with all my just debts out of the first money which may come into his hands belonging to my estate.

Second I give and devise to my two nephews William Stephens and Arthur Stephens a certain piece of real estate in Murphy Township, Cherokee County, North Carolina adjoining the lands of Eli Dossary and others containing one hundred acres, more or less, to share equally in it, some.

Third I give and devise my undivided one half interest in a certain piece of land lying on Cook Creek in County and state aforesaid to be sold to fulfill my request in the first of my will, the remainder, if any are left, to be equally divided between the living children of my father, Rachel Stephens.

Fourth I further devise that if I die possessed of any store or other personal property of any kind that my executor sell the same and equally divide the same, share and share alike between my above named heirs.

Test: I hereby constitute and appoint my Executor
J.P. Dorey, my lawful Executor to all intents
and purposes to execute this my last will
and testament according to the true intent and
meaning of the same and every part and
clause thereof, hereby revoking and declaring
void all other wills and testaments
by me heretofore made.

have hereunto set my hand and seal, this
