was of sound mind and memory, of full age to execute a Will, and was not under any restraint, to the knowledge, information or belief of this deponent; And further these deponents say not.

I, Julius W. Stiles, of the aforesaid County and State, being of sound mind, but considering the uncertainty of my earthly existence, do make and declare this my last will and testament:

First. My executrix, hereinafter named, shall give my body a decent burial, suitable to the wishes of my friends and relatives, and

pay all funeral expences, together with all my just debts out of the first moneys which may come into her hands belonging to my estate.

Second. I give and devise to my beloved wife, Mollie Stiles, the tracts of land upon which I now reside, containing 150 acres more or less, for and during her natural life.

Third. I give and devise to my said beloved wife, Mollie Stiles, for and during her natural life, all of the rest and residue of my property of every kind and description, including both real estate and personal property, wheresoever situated or located, she to have and use said property during her natural life for her care and support.

Fourth. I give and devise to my three sons, Oliver Stiles, Clem Stiles and Hall Stiles, share and share alike, all of my property of every kind and description, including both real estate and personal property, wheresoever situated or located, at the time of my death, subject to the life estate of my said wife as devised in paragraph two and three of this my will.

It being my will and desire that my said wife, Mollie Stiles, take all of my property of every kind and description wheresoever situated at my death for and during her natural life and that after her death my said three sons Oliver Stiles, Clem Stiles, and Hall Stiles, take in fee simple all of my real estate, as above set out subject to the life estate of my said wife, and that they take all of my personal property which was not used by my said wife during her life for her use and support, but my said wife to have all of said

property during her natural life and to use all of the same that may be necessary for her use and support.

Fifth. I hereby constitute and appoint my beloved wife, Mollie Stiles, my lawful executrix to all intents and purposes, to execute this my last will and testament, according to the true intent and meaning of the same, and every part and clause thereof, hereby revoking and declaring utterly void all other Wills and testaments by me heretofore made.

In witness whereof, I, the said Julius W. Stiles, do hereinbelow set my hand and seal, this the 25<sup>th</sup> day of April, 1931.
