Will of Nancy Hayes Fulmer

I, Nancy Hayes Fulmer, of Tomotla, Cherokee County, North Carolina, being of sound mind, do make, publish and declare this to be my last will and I hereby revoke all former wills made by me.

After all my just debts are paid, including my funeral expense, I will, bequeath and devise my property as follows:

First I will and bequeath to my brother J. J. Hayes, all money due me, at my death, by J. E. Coburn of Bryson City, N. C., the amount of which, is fully set out in a contract, made on the 1st day of April 1927, between J. E. Coburn and myself. I held as collateral, as set out in said contract, see

(10) Shares of Alaska Lumber Company stock and I hereby direct my executor, hereinafter named, to deliver to J.E. Coburn, the ten (10) shares of stock, as soon as he has paid the amount due, as set out in the contract above referred to.

Second I will and bequeath to my sister, M.E. Leatherwood such of my clothing as she may want. One heavy white bed spread, one Cameo Brooch, my Bible, my Hymn Book, Fountain Pen and Father's Picture, in a frame.

Third I will and bequeath to my niece Eddie Leatherwood the family records I have kept, to be preserved and taken care of; also, any money she may owe me at my death.

Fourth I will and bequeath to my niece Leila Hayes the furniture in my room, with my bed, to remain as it is.

Fifth I will and bequeath to my niece Helen Hayes, two quilts and one fine blanket.

Sixth I will and bequeath to my niece Jennie Swain, one student lamp, one whit counterpane and embroidered dresser scarf.

Seventh I will and bequeath to my niece Mattie Leatherwood one signet gold ring.

Eighth I will and bequeath to my niece Hattie Farmer, one heavy gold ring.

There are some other things, such as bed quilts, sheets, towels and other little things that I hope can be divided without contention.

My brother Jeff Hayes furnished me room and board for a number of years and I am leaving what I have to him to pay for any trouble I have been.

I hereby appoint J.I. Hayes as executor of this my last will, he to serve without having to give bond.
