Calvard the testator aforesaid, did, at the time of subscribing his name as aforesaid, declare the said paper writing as subscribed by him and exhibited to be his last will and testament, and this deponent did thereupon subscribe his name at the end of said will, as an attesting witness thereto, and at the request and in the presence of said testator. And this deponent further saith that at the ^{same} time when the said testator subscribed his name to the said last will as aforesaid, and at the time of the deponent's subscribing his name as attesting witness thereto, as aforesaid, the said Robert L. Calvard

was of sound mind and memory, of full age to execute a will, and was not under any restraint, to the knowledge, information or belief of this deponent; And further these deponents say not.

I, Robert L. Calvard of the aforesaid County and State, being of sound mind, but considering the uncertainty of my earthly existence, do make and declare this my last will and testament:

First, my executor hereinafter named, shall

give my body a decent burial, suitable to the wishes of my friends and relatives, and pay all of my funeral expenses, together with all of my just debts if any, out of the first money which may come into his hands belonging to my estate.

Second: I give and devise to my beloved wife Rosie Belle Colvard, all of my property of each and every kind, whether real estate personal property or mixed, including lands, houses, household and kitchen furniture, money on hand, money in Banks either on checking account or on certificate of deposit, notes, bonds, stocks, accounts or any other evidence of assets of every kind and nature, to her personal use forever.

Third: I hereby constitute and appoint my trusty friend Benjamin G. Grant, my lawful executor to all intents and purposes, to execute this my last will and testament, according to its true intent and meaning, and every part and clause thereof - hereby revoking and declaring utterly void all other wills and testaments by me heretofore made.

Fourth: Having the utmost confidence in the honor and integrity of my executor hereinbefore named, it is my will and request that he not be required to execute a bond as said executor as provided by law, but that he shall proceed to perform the duties of said executor as provided for in paragraph three of this my last will and testament at the least expense possible.

In witness whereof I, the said Robert L. Colvard, do hereunto set my hand and seal, this the 11th day of June, 1930.
