Item 1 Our executor hereinafter named, shall give each of our bodies a decent burial, suitable to the wish of our friends and relations, which is to include ordinary tombstones to the grave of each, and pay all funeral expenses, together with all our just debts, out of the money which may come into his hands from the sale of property belonging to our estate and of debts owing to the estate.

Item 2 Our will is that our executor shall sell as soon as may be all our estate both real and personal, together with household and kitchen furniture, all domestic animals and fowl that have not been heretofore sold by us or either of us, and divide the proceeds of the sale among all our brothers and sisters, or their legal representatives, in equal proportion, share and share alike, one share to the heirs of our sister Nancy Griffiths heirs, one to John Truett heirs, one to James Truett heirs, one to Jane Frances heirs, one to Charles Truett and to Matt Truett.

Item 3 We hereby constitute and appoint our mutual friend George T. Hendrix our lawful executor to all intents and purposes to execute this our last will and testament according to the true intent and meaning of the same, every part and clause thereof, hereby revoking and declaring utterly void all other wills and testaments by us heretofore made.
