4. I expect at the time of my death a debt and suspicious sum.
5. I give Susan Craig and Foster Ted and five of my quilts.
6. I give and be it that the balance of my bed clothes to equally divided between all of my children with Conner and Holland here - or such a part of them that want them with some expenses.
7. I give that my Holland children shall have what silver money I have at my death also my house hold furniture, comprising 1 sewing machine, 1 bed, 2 beds, 2 bureaus, 1 sofa and 1 washstand and 5 or 6 chairs, and if there any money in hand after my funeral is paid for it is my will and request that a trustee be named at my house to move my last said things, such to be as and in my circumstances could afford witness my hand.
