I Gustave M. Blumenthal a resident of the City of Atlanta, County of Fulton & State of Georgia being of sound and disposing mind & memory & mindful of the uncertainty of human Existence & of the necessity of disposing of the property accumulated in life, in view of the certainty of death, do hereby make publick & declare this to be my Last Will & Testament in manner following, that is to say:

First: After the payment of all my just debts funeral expenses & cost of probating & recording this Will, and filing an inventory of my estate in the proper Courts, I give, devise and bequeath to my dear wife Matilda M. Blumenthal as long as she remains my widow and unmarried, all the rest, residue & remainder of my estate real or personal, separate & community, to hold use and enjoy, the profits, fruit revenue increase and income, therefrom during her said widowhood, subject only to the payment by her during her said widowhood of twenty per centum of said profits, fruit revenue & income, to Walter Blumenthal in the City, County and State, to Siegfried Blumenthal, Paul Blumenthal, Mita Blumenthal and Lent Blumenthal or their heirs now living in the City of Hammerstein, West Prussia, Europe, said payment to be made quarterly, hereby taking absolutely in my said wife, Matilda M. Blumenthal during her widowhood after my decease fifty per centum of the profits, fruit, revenue increase and income of my real & personal estate.

Should my said wife Matilda M. Blumenthal marry after my decease in that event the shall be paid to her four thousand Dollars, property owned by her when I married her, and paid for her account, also my life insurance in the New York Mutual already written in her name I further give devised & bequeath to my said wife Matilda M. Blumenthal

I give devise and bequeath to my said nephews Walter Siegfried, Paul, Mita and Lent Blumenthal or their heirs through my said wife as long as she is my widow the said twenty five centum of the profits, revenues & fruits and income of my real and personal estate, to be to them & said nephews by my said wife Matilda M. Blumenthal from and after the marriage of my said wife or should she stay my widow to her children, then after her death, I give devise and bequeath to my said real and personal estate in which my said wife has the said interest as contained in first and second paragraph and all the balance of my estate to the following named persons or their heirs, etc is to say: One fourth of all our Land to Siegfried Blumenthal, One fourth to Mita Blumenthal, one fourth to Lent Blumenthal one eighth to Paul Blumenthal. All these live at present in Hammerstein, West Prussia & one eighth to Walter Blumenthal at Present in Atlanta Ga., or their lawful heirs in fee absolute at the age of twenty five years.

I further direct that my said wife Matilda M. Blumenthal can wife the above named residence in Murphy N.C. or the amount if over to Doctor Sheik as shall be hers absolute.

An inventory as near as possible correct will accompany this my last will & testament.

Should my wife not survive me then I further direct that in case an exec John Ford and David Kirk at this time residents of the City of Corpus Christi County of Nueces and State of Texas be nominated, Constituted & appointed.

I do hereby nominate constitute and appoint them Executrix of this my last will & testament.

I hereby nominate, constitute and appoint my said wife Matilda M. Blumenthal should she survive me as sole executrix of my last will and testament and it is my will that any bond or bonds shall not be required of her as such executrix, and that no other action shall be had in the probate or other Courts in

relation to the management, settlement and partition of my estate upon its proof registering and record of this my will and the return of filing of an inventory of my estate.

I hereby make all former wills & testaments by me made and executed, and especially revoke and declare null and void & of no effect a codicil made in the Republic of Mexico in the State of Coahuila Ed City of Saltillo and dated April 28th 1886 which was recorded July 16th 1886 in the Town of Corpus Christi, County of Nueces & State of Texas.

In witness whereof, I Gustav M. Blumenthal have to this my last Will & Testament consisting of five pages of writing, the fifth page being pasted to the first four pages set my hand and seal this the tenth day of January in the year of our Lord One thousand eight hundred & Ninety four.
