

Record of Wills

In the name of God amen I Henry Mop of the County of Cherokee and State of Tennessee being in health of body and of Sound mind and memory and understanding praise be God for the same, do make this my last will and Testament in manner and form following.

I give devise and bequeath unto my beloved wife Eliza Mop all her household and Kitchen furniture she had when I married her and also such other clothing she has made since our marriage and also the land that she owned before our marriage and one black man 12 years old and two and two hundred dollars in money and one buggy that we have on hand.

I give and devise to my youngest son A. H. Mop all the tract of land where he now lives to him and to hold to him and his heirs in fee simple forever.

The balance of my lands property to be equally divided among the balance of my children after my wife Eliza Mop's dower is laid off.

I give and devise to my eldest son W. H. Mop the dower of my beloved wife after her death to him and to hold to him and his heirs in fee simple forever. I give and devise to Gideon Callaway Mop the heir of W. H. Mop three hundred dollars to be paid out of my estate notwithstanding disposed of.

I give and devise to my youngest daughter Christina R. Palmer my sewing machine to have and to hold.

The remainder property to be equally divided among my children.

And Lastly I do hereby constitute and appoint my trusty friend W. H. Mop my lawful executor to all intents and purposes to execute the my last will and Testament according to the true intent and meaning of the same and over part and clause thereof hereby revoking all other will and Testaments by me heretofore made.
