I, L. H. Hildreth of the County of Cherokee and State of North Carolina being of Sound Mind and disposing Memory, do hereby declare and publish this as my last will and Testament in manner and form following that is to say -

First it is my will and desire that my wife
Lucia Sedona have hold and enjoy during her
natural life, the best of land which I now live
it being land 1026 - in Dist- 108 - bounded as follow
Beginning on a small Spanish oak on the point of
a dead tree corner of 1024 and runs East 100 poles
to a small Hickory and black oak in the edge of a
hollow thence 174 - poles to a stone and pointing
on the line of 1020 - thence east point the line on
the line of 1019 - one hundred and forty poles to a
small pointed corner of 1020 - thence South West
line to the beginning containing one hundred and four
acres except that part called the old mill pond
supposed to be about two acres.

Second It is my will and desire that my wife Lucia
Leaford in renting said lands give the preference
to my children they or any of them comprehend
the terms agreed upon between them and my
wife

said. It is my will and desire that after the death
 of my wife Laura Leeper that the tract of land
 described in the first item of this will be divided
 between my son Joseph Leeper Bely 6 Leeper
 according to conventional lines made by me as
 follows. Beginning on ^{the} ~~the~~ corner of a large Apple
 tree on the West line of said tract in a post
 hollow - running thence S. E. to the top of a ridge to a
 State corner south the line crossing the State road
 to a post oak stump above to Spring 1 thence
 running angling up said ridge to the second gap
 known as the Crow foot hollow gap to a State
 corner due east striking the east line of said
 tract of land to a State the North portion or
 upper part of said tract to be Bely 13 Leeper
 subject to the following terms and conditions

equivalent to be a charge upon said land of land the
one third in value thereof being about one hundred
and twenty dollars
