

Record of Will

In the name of God, Amen.

Oct 27 1885

I, Isaac Mauney of the County of Cherokee in the State of North Carolina, being of Sound Mind and disposing Memory do make this my last Will and Testament in manner and form following that is to say that my Executors hereinafter named provide for my body a decent Christian burial and pay all my just debts out of the first money ^{which may} come to their hands out of my Estate.

Secondly I Will and bequeath to my beloved wife Emily all my Home hold and kitchen furniture, all my Hogs cattle horses & other like Stock and Farming implements of whatever kind together with all my Real Estate except that part this day contracted to Ambros H Mauney & Sylvanus Mauney and excepting further what lands one hand has or will which is allotted to Perkins Grady to be used by him for his support during his Natural life, and the lands voided to my wife Emily and Chatter is only for term of her Natural life. My Executors hereafter will allot the land to Perkins Grady immediately if request to do so having due regard to my wife's interest.

Thirdly I Will and bequeath to my beloved Son Ambros H Mauney, Sylvanus Mauney & George R. Mauney to have and their heirs all my Real Estate in the said County of Cherokee with the encumbrance of my wife's life estate and with conditions expressed as follows that I bequeath to ^{Sylvanus Mauney} Mauney ~~three~~ one hundred and twenty acres of land as contains and described in a survey of the date North of the center of the Lempster road including the dwelling house where E & J Mauney live. It is hereby made and declared as my last Will that if my Son George R Mauney be dead at his death then and in that case all the estate provided for him in this my Will shall be equally divided between my two Sons Ambros H Mauney & Sylvanus Mauney & their heirs in the event of the death of Ambros H or Sylvanus Mauney before

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= the Probate of this Will their respective heirs take what is intended for them according respectively. Having heretofore advanced papers and other property to my Son Lin Mauney and to my Daughter Mrs Celestia Monow-dana, wife of E J Monow & Mary Malinda wife or widow of Alexander Angel Dennis I hereby declare that they and each of them are not entitled to any thing more of my Estate nor their heirs.

Lastly I hereby Will and appoint my trusty friends Ambros H Mauney and Joseph Lerner to execute this my last Will and Testament hereby revoking all other paper writings purporting to be my Will.
