Do make and declare this my last Will
and Testament hereby revoking all other Wills
by me or in my Name heretofore made
Article 1st I Will and bequeath to my
Wife Rebecca Safford one house Ladder and
Furnish and one Tragedy
Article 2^d I Will and bequeath to my daughter
Daniel Isabel one Coat, one Bed and
Furniture

Article 3^d I Will and bequeath to my Beloved
Wife Jane one Cow all the hogs on hand and
to have hold and Fidelity Furniture not
otherwise disposed of Also I Will to her my
present Furniture being a part of the tract on
which James Mundy had now lived I have and
to hold during the term of her natural life to be
long as she shall remain a widow in my Name
Article 4th I Will and bequeath to my Son
William Safford and my two daughters Daniel
Isabel and Mary all of my lands including
my homestead to be divided equally among them
after the death of my wife Jane or when she
shall forfeit her right as homestead provided
I further Will and bequeath to my Son Daniel
James Reed to my daughter being David William
Payne and Caroline Reed and to each one
dollar to be paid at the death of my wife Jane
Signed and sealed this 10th day of April
1813 in the year of our Lord one thousand
eight hundred and twenty two
