The 1st day of
March 1872

I James Whitaker of the County of Chester
and State of South Carolina, being of sound
mind and memory but Considering the
uncertainty of my earthly existence do
make and declare this my last will and
testament in manner and form as following
that is to say

Will that my Executor hereafter named shall
provide for my wife a decent Memorial Suitable
to the virtues of my children and friends the
expenses to be paid out of my Estate also to
pay all your debts & expenses over bearing out of
myself money that may come into his hands a part
of my Estate.

Item, I will and leave to my beloved wife Mary
all that lot of land on which I live the addition
of Seven County or forty acres青年 cattle that
she does to me by William H. Graham, Esq. was worth with other
things, all my implements of husbandry and
house hold and kitchen furniture with the
stock of house cattle and horses for her own proper
use and benefit during her natural life. The
property she brought from Bosccombe is her own
and purpose of us she may think proper.

Item, I sign and appoint to my Executor before my
death and faithful house keeper one hundred
dollars in money to pay when that amount is
collected from the sale of my property.

Item, the lot of land #125 in District 107 to be sold
back with lot property books &c and the proceeds
after paying debts and expenses and paying over to
Lorraine Cooper one hundred dollars divided
amongst my children in equal proportions.
Item, I give and bequeath to my son John all
my interest in the Suggsana Silver or Copper Mine
in lot 1036 in District 107 for his own use and
benefit.

Item, After the death of my wife Mary the property
remaining be sold to debts that may be then owing
Collected and the money of any over and above
expenses to be equally divided and paid over to
all my children in District 107.

and the other over myself each one to show that we
were all under God's care.

And lastly I do hereby constitute and appoint my brother
James William Waller Esq. my lawful Executor to
all intents and purposes to execute this my last will
and testament according to the true intent and meaning
thereof and every part and clause thereof hereby
not altering and changing none of other wills and
testaments of the testator or master.
