I, J. F. Frank of the County of Macon and State of North Carolina, being of sound mind & memory, but considering the uncertainty of earthly existence do make and declare this my last will & testament in manner and form following, that is to say: First: that my executors hereinafter named shall provide for my body a decent burial, satisfy the wishes of my relatives and friends and pay all funeral expenses including suitable tombstones to be put at my grave, together with all my just debts, claims and to whomsoever owing, out of the moneys that may first come into this land as a part and parcel of my estate.

Second: I give to my daughter, Mary Elvira Henry and her husband John B. Henry during their natural lives the following boundary of land viz: Beginning on a Spanish oak in the lane near J. B. Henry's, thence with the road to the Wolf Run gap, thence with the Orion move main road to the gap of the old road bare place, thence across the road, thence with the meanders of the ridge to Berry's line including all my lands South & East of said line in Millsboro Township. the valuation of same to be four hundred dollars.

I give to my daughter Amy Elizabeth Wild, land as follows: Beginning on a white oak on top of hill, thence a straight line to the bare, thence to the road at foot of Rabbit Creek, thence with John Hinesland's line, and as the line may be so as to include all lands South & East back to Mary C. Henry's line, the valuation of same to be five hundred and fifty dollars.

I give to my son E. F. Frank & my daughter-in-law Mary M. Frank wife of J. F. Frank: Beginning on a white oak near the Griffe Spring thence in a southerly direction to the top of ridge thence with the top of ridge to our main line including all the lands known as the Henry's deer lands, the valuation of same to be one thousand dollars.

I give to my son Ernest A. Frank's land as follows: Beginning on a hilltop on top of a mountain, E. F. Frank's corner thence a straight line to the Columbia fallers on Whitson's Run

Between the dams, thence in a northerly direction to the line running from Whitford to A. Squaders line, thence with said line to Alfred Squaders corner & so as to include all my lands between said line & L. J. Franks land; the value of same to be four hundred dollars.

I give to my daughter Sarah Ann Collins and the heirs of my daughter Martha P. Collins deceased (Ruth Collins) Minnie H. Sellman and James A. Collins, lands as follows:

All of my lands on Watonga Creek above Everett J. Franks line not heretofore sold including the J. Samuels land, the big run lands, the Kunkland lands, the value of the same to be fourteen hundred dollars.

I further desire that my executor hereinafter to be appointed take charge of all my real & personal property not included in the foregoing Will and dispose of it according to law so that each child shall be made equal.

I hereby appoint E. H. Franks and J. C. Will as Executors of this my last Will.
