In the name of God Amen
I John D. Brundt being now in my proper mind
do hereby make and confirm this my last will
and Testament
That after all my just and honest debts shall have
been paid that for and in consideration of the
love and good will that I bear to my two sons
William W. Brundt and H. V. Brundt and for the
further consideration that the said W. W. Brundt and
H. V. Brundt shall pay or cause to be paid to
my Daughters or their heirs namely Mary
Catharine Waldrup Manda Minerva Caroline
Cecily and Josephine Evans the sum of
Fifty Dollars each the aggregate being the sum
of Two hundred Dollars to be equally paid between
the said W. W. Brundt and H. V. Brundt but not to
be considered due nor on interest during the natural
life of the said J. D. Brundt and his wife Eliza
Brundt and for the consideration aforesaid I do
grant confirm and convey to my son W. W. Brundt
and his heirs forever in fee simple all of my tract
of Land that lays west of the main branch and to
my son H. V. Brundt all of my tract of Land that
lays east of the said branch the dividing line to
stand from the North Boundary line to the South
Boundary line of the same Crispin Little Brasstown
Creek to have and to hold the same to the said
H. V. Brundt and his heirs forever in fee simple
with this additional Covenant on the part of the
H. V. Brundt that he shall support maintain and
supply with food and raiment suitable to their
Condition; The said J. D. Brundt and his wife
Eliza during their natural lives at their deaths
the said H. V. Brundt or his heirs is to inherit the
personal property if there be any belonging to the
said J. D. Brundt or Eliza Brundt
Now this is intended to be and contain all the virtue
of a good and lawful will with the strict com-
pliance with this Covenant. In testimony whereof
