Be it remembered that on the 22nd day of March in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and ninety four the last will and Testament of Caldo S. Bragg, late of this County deceased was presented to this Court for probate and record, clothed in the words and figures following to-wit:-

My Last Will and Testament of Caldo S. Bragg.

I, Caldo S. Bragg, do make and publish this my last will and Testament.
First: I give and bequeath to my son, Cairus C. Bragg, all the stock in the American Book Company of which I may be the owner at the time of my decease.
Second: I give, devise and bequeath to my wife Mary, a Bragg (if she survive me) all my property of every kind wherever and howsoever situated. to be hers, absolutely (the real estate in fee simple) and appoint her to be the executrix of this my will, and desire that no bond be required of her, and that there shall be no appraisement or inventory of my estate.
But if my said wife be not living at the time of my decease, then it is my will that all my property and estate, except my stock in the American Book Company, hereinafter given to my son Cairus C. Bragg, shall be disposed of as follows:
I do hereby give and bequeath to my Grandson
