I, Sarah Hisselburg of the
aforesaid state and county, being
of sound mind and memory,
but considering the uncertainty
of my earthly existence, do make
and declare this my last will
and testament:

First: My executor herein-
after named shall defray all my
funeral expenses and shall pay
of my self and husband, all
that my daughter is payed for
taking care of me during my
sickness - a reasonable sum. Pay
all my just debts and have tomb
stones erected to and the grave
enclosed of both me and my
husband.

Second: Pay the following named
debts of my husband, viz: To Luther
Hisselburg, Allie Culbertson, Van
Lance, George Hyatt and Mrs. J.
M. Sickey, and any other minor
debts that may be considered just
by my executor in the order named.
The Ante-Mortem to my executor.

Third: That my son Edwin
shall account to the estate for one
note \$100⁰⁰ less a cr. of \$50⁰⁰, unless
he can satisfactorily show to my exe-
cutor that he has paid. Also my
son Lu shall account to the estate
for a \$200⁰⁰ note.

Fourth: That the remainder
of the estate shall be equally divided
among my five children, provided,
that they all shall work together
in the interest of the estate in
paying off the mortgage that is
now upon the farm. Any child
who shall refuse to advance their

quote of said mortgage, or to try
to cause to be advanced shall be paid
the sum of \$25⁰⁰, and excluded from
his or her part in the farm. It being
my object in the above clause to pre-
vent any one through their careles-
ness or contrariness to cause the
other children to lose their part of
the farm.

Fifth: I do hereby constitute and
appoint L. B. Hisselburg my lawful
executor to all intents and purposes to
execute this my last will and tes-
tament according to true intent and
meaning of same, and every part
and clause thereof hereby revoking all
former wills by me made.
