which is to be reserved to her at once
after my death, she is also to have one
thousand dollars in cash and all the
furnished and unfurnished furniture except
one corner dresser which I want
Ruth Hall to have for her share with

thousand dollars in cash.

I want Blanche Taylor to have three
hundred dollars in cash and the
insurance against J. H. Collington and
Jas. Catling and 7 Berksville.

hundred dollars in cash to be spent
