I, Virginia B. Dawson of the State, County & City above named being of sound mind and disposing mind and memory but fearing the uncertainty of this mortal life do hereby make publick and declare the following to be my last will & testament, to wit:

Item 1. I do hereby nominate, constitute & appoint Alley Lee Baker of Raleigh N.C. the Executor of this my last will and testament & direct him to pay all my just & honest debts and my funeral expenses (including the cost of the inscription on the monument therein after referred to and also the cost of putting in good condition, at the time of my death my burial lot in Oakwood Cemetery near Raleigh N.C.)

Item 2. I give and bequeath Six Thousand Dollars (\$6,000.00) (face value) of the stock now owned by me in the First National Bank of Charlotte N.C., and also Two Hous and Decrees (\$2,000.00) (face value) of the bonds of the Virginia Cotton Mills, Alamance County N.C. now owned by me to said Alley Lee Baker in trust for my grand niece Mary C. Melone of Coopers County N.C. her husband Giles Melone, my niece Mrs. E.C. Melone of Grimesboro N.C. my niece Mrs. Janie Y. Smith, of Smithville Charlotte County Virginia and my nephew, DeBonies Y. Melone of Alamance County N.C. as follows:

Plente the death of both my said sister, Mary C. Melone and of her said Husband, Giles Melone to collect the dividends on said stock and the coupons on said bonds and also income therefrom, & at the maturity of said bonds to collect the principal of the same and re-invest such principal in such manner as he deems best & to collect the income from such investments & to pay said dividend of coupon and income money to said Mary C. Melone, during her natural life (to be used by her as she sees fit,) & upon the death of said Mary C. Melone to said Giles Melone

if he shall survive her during his natural life and upon the death of the survivor of said Mary C. Melone to said Husband, Giles Melone to transfer said stock & bonds or the investment acts which they may have been converted to said Mrs. E.C. Melone, Janie Y. Smith & DeBonies Y. Melone, equally, share and share alike, their executors administrators & assigns.

I give and bequeath absolutely Two Thousand Two Dollars (\$2,000.00) face value) of the stock now owned by me in the Commercial & Farmers Bank of Raleigh N.C. to my niece Mrs. Emma C. Melone the daughter of Annie C. Melone, both of Grimesboro N.C. equally share and share alike. I also give & bequeath one thousand two & one half Decrees (\$1,000.00) (face value) of the stock now owned by me in said Commercial ~~Bank~~ and Farmers Bank and also Two Hous and & one half Decrees (\$2,000.00) (face value) of the bonds of the Virginia Cotton Mills, Alamance County N.C. now owned by me to said Alley Lee Baker to be by him held upon the trusts and for the following uses & purposes to wit:

During the natural life of my grand niece Mary C. Melone (now Parker) of Graham N.C. to collect the dividends upon said stock & the coupons upon said bonds at the maturity of said bonds to collect the principal thereof and reinvest said principal in such manner as he deems best & collect the income from said investments & to pay and divide said coupon & income money to said Mary C. Melone (now Parker) during her natural life & at her death said stocks bonds or investments in which they may have been converted shall be transferred, delivered and conveyed absolutely by the trustee to such child or children as said Mary C. Melone shall leave her surviving, but if said Mary C. Melone shall not leave any child or children surviving her, then at her death said stock bonds or investments shall be delivered, transferred and conveyed absolutely by the trustee to said Annie C. Melone.

I give and bequeath my two Bonds (numbered 126 and 127) of the City of Grimesboro N.C. and for \$500.00 to said Janie Y. Smith, absolutely.

I give and bequeath Four thousand Dollars (\$4,000.00) (face value) of the stock now owned by me in

North Carolina Railroad Company, to my said nephew Dr. Berrien G. Melbone and to his Daughter Virginia G. Melbone (now McGarry) to be by them held in the following proportions & upon the following terms and conditions to wit:

Until the death of said Dr. Berrien G. Melbone he shall receive have and use as he sees fit the dividends on said stocks & other income therefrom but at his death the said stocks shall belong to & be held absolutely by said Virginia G. Melbone (now McGarry) her executors, administrators or assigns.

I give and bequeath Four Thousand Dollars (\$4000.00) (face value) of the bonds of the Virginia Cotton Mills, Alamance County N.C. now owned by me to said Abby Lee Baker to be by her held upon the trusts and for the following uses and purposes to wit:

To collect the coupons upon the same until the maturity of said bonds & to pay said collections to Mrs. Anna G. Melbone of Greensboro N.C. & Mrs. Jessie G. Long of Mecklenburg County N.C. equally there and there else where their executors administrators or assigns and at the maturity of said bonds to deliver bonds and convey the same absolutely to said Anna G. Melbone & Jessie G. Long equally there and there else, their executors, administrators or assigns.

I also give and bequeath Four Thousand and one-half Dollars (\$3000.00) (face value) of said bonds to Abby Lee Baker to be by her held upon the trusts and for the following uses & purposes to wit: To collect the coupons upon the same until the maturity of said bonds & to pay said collections to the two daughters (Eva & Kate) of Mrs. E.P. Lett et al decedents, late of Caswell County N.C. & at the maturity of said bonds to transfer absolutely convey the said bonds absolutely to said Eva & Kate Lett.

If either the said Eva or Kate shall die before the maturity of said bonds leaving a child or children surviving her then such child or children shall stand in the place of their deceased mother and receive the same benefits from this legacy as their mother would have received; if either the

said Eva or Kate shall die before the maturity of said bonds without leaving any child or children surviving her then her share in this legacy shall go and belong to her surviving sister. If both the said Eva & Kate shall die before the maturity of said bonds without having any child or children surviving them, then & in that event said bonds shall go as a part of the residuum of my estate and be disposed of in the manner provided in item 27 hereof for the disposition of said residuum.

I give and bequeath Six Thousand Dollars (\$6000.) (face value) of the stock now owned by me in the First National Bank of Charlotte N.C. and also three thousand Dollars (\$3000.00) (face value) of the bonds of the Virginia Cotton Mills, Alamance County N.C. now owned by me to Abby Lee Baker in trust for my sister Mrs. Ann E.Y. Womack, of Caswell County N.C., my niece Mrs. Jessie G. Neal of Greensville N.C., my nephews J.P. Horneak of Caswell County N.C. my niece Mrs. Salie H. Wiggins of Caswell County N.C. and such child or children as said Dallie H. Wiggins may have then surviving, as follows:

Until the death of my said Ann E.Y. Womack to collect the dividends on said stock and the coupons on said bonds and other income therefrom & at the maturity of said bonds to collect the principal of the same and retain said principal in such manner as to deposit and to collect the income from such investments and to pay said dividends coupons & income money to said Ann E.Y. Womack during her natural life (to be used by her as she sees fit) and upon the death of said Ann E.Y. Womack two-thirds ( $\frac{2}{3}$ ) of said stock and bonds or its investments into which they may have been converted shall be transferred delivered and conveyed by said Horneak absolutely to said Jessie G. Neal and J.P. Horneak equally there and there above their executors administrators or assigns, & the remaining one-third ( $\frac{1}{3}$ ) thereof shall be held by said Baker in trust for the following uses and purposes to wit:

Until the death of said Dallie H. Wiggins to receive the dividends coupons and other income money therefrom and to pay such dividends coupons & income money to the said Dallie H. Wiggins during her natural life

To be used by her as she sees fit and at the death of said Jessie H. Wiggins if she shall have any child or children surviving her over one third of said Bank Stock and Cotton Mill bonds or the investments into which they may have been converted shall be delivered transferred and conveyed by the trustee absolutely to such child or children equally there and there alive, but if the said Jessie H. Wiggins shall not have any child or children surviving her then and in that event at the death of said Jessie H. Wiggins said one third of the said Bank Stock and Cotton Mill bonds or the investments into which they may have been converted shall be transferred delivered & conveyed by said trustee absolutely to said T. P. Monrook & Norrine G. Neal equally there and there alive, their executors administrators or

Item 8. I give and bequeath Two Thousand Dollars (\$2000.00) (face value) of the bonds of the Western North Carolina Railway Company, now owned by me, to said Abby Lee B. St. in trust for said T. P. Monrook, Norrine G. Neal, Jessie H. Wiggins, and next child or children as said Jessie H. Wiggins may have surviving her as follows:

To hold use and dispose of the same & them come herefrom and the investments into which they may be converted in the same manner upon the same trusts and for the same uses & purposes as is prescribed in item 7 hereof forth holding using and disposing, at the death of said T. P. Monrook of the remaining one-third  $\frac{1}{3}$  of the said Stock and bonds therein referred to, for the benefit of said Monrook, Neal, Wiggins and the children.

Item 9. I give and bequeath to said Norrine G. Neal absolutely, the Five Thousand Dollars (\$5000.00) (face value) of 5% bonds and the Sixteen Thousand Dollars (\$1600.00) (face value) of purfined Stock of the Southern Railway Company, received by me in exchange for the Five Thousand Dollars (\$5000.00) (face value) of bonds of the Charlotte, Columbia and Augusta Railway Company heretofore owned by me.

Item 10. I give and bequeath to said Norrine G. Neal & Abby Lee B. St. all my furniture, clothing,

plate, silverware, pictures, carpets, beds, bed clothes, house hold and kitchen furniture utensils, appliances etc. I request that the use and disposal of the same in the manner indicated in a private letter addressed by me to Steer, which will be found in my private desk.

Item 11. I give and bequeath absolutely to Dr. John H. McAden of Charlotte N.C. Five Thousand Dollars (\$5000.00) (face value) of the stock now owned by me in the Wachovia and Farmers National Bank of Charlotte N.C.

Item 12. I give and bequeath the note from McAden Mills of Gaston County N.C. endorsed by Dr. John H. McAden payable to me for Ten Thousand Dollars (\$10,000.00) to said Dr. John H. McAden in trust for the sole benefit of his three daughters, Fanny Yancy McAden, Anna J. McAden, and Jessie J. McAden equally there

Item 13. I give and bequeath Three Thousand Dollars (\$3000.00) face value of the bonds of the Virginia Cotton Mills, Alamance County N.C., now owned by me to said Abby Lee B. St. to be held by him in trust for the following uses & purposes to wit:

To collect the coupons on said bonds or the income from the investments into which they may be converted and to pay said coupon & income money directly to Benzie V. McAden, of Raleigh N.C. and not to be given or left to spend it for her benefit during her life except the time of her arrival at the age of twenty one years at which time said bonds or the investments into which they may be converted, shall be transferred delivered & conveyed absolutely by said trustee to said Benzie V. McAden, if the said Benzie V. McAden shall die before arriving at the age of twenty one years leaving a child or children surviving her then from the time of said death said trustee shall pay said coupon and income money to such child or children or the survivors of them until the arrival at the age of twenty one years of all such children or of the survivors of them at which time said bonds or the investments into which they may be converted shall be transferred delivered & conveyed absolutely by the trustee to such child or children or the survivors of them; but if the said Benzie V. McAden shall die before arriving at the age of twenty-one years without leaving any child or children said

ving day, then and from the time of said death said Trustee shall pay said Deacon and his wife money to her brothers Rufus & McAden & James Thomas McAden until the survivors of them until the arrival at the age of twenty one years of both of them or of the survivor of them at which time said Bonds with investments into which they may have been converted, shall be transferred delivered & charged by said Trustee absolutely to said Rufus & McAden and James Thomas McAden or the survivors of them.

Item 14

I give and desire my old houses and lot now belonging to me, at the north west corner of the intersection of Hillsboro and Sulivans Streets in Raleigh N.C. now occupied by me as a residence to said Abby Lee Baker absolutely & in fee simple. I regret that said Baker, never occupy and use said houses & lot as his permanent future home. I also ask said Baker that he bear in mind & carry out the requests heretofore made of him by me.

Item 15

I give and bequeath One Thousand Dollars (\$1000.00) (face value) of the bonds of the Piedmont Manufacturing Company, now owned by me, to Mrs Harriet Andrews of Raleigh N.C. absolutely.

Item 16

I give devise and bequeath absolutely and in fee simple to Charles Cardwell of Raleigh N.C. the sum of One Hundred Dollars (\$100.00) in money and also One Thousand Dollars (\$1000.00) (face value) of the Alamance County, Horne Bonds, now owned by me and also the house and lot on the East side of Blount between Rose & Cabarrus Streets in Raleigh N.C. now owned by me, formerly belonging to said Charles Cardwell & purchased by me at foreclosure sale. I also hereby release and discharge said Cardwell from all claims and demands which I have against him by reason of said house and lot.

I also give and bequeath absolutely to Felix Johnson of Raleigh N.C. the sum of One Thousand Dollars (\$1000) in money and also One Thousand Dollars (\$1000.00) (face value.) of the McDowell County N.C. bonds now owned by me.

The legacies devised in this item are given in consideration of the faithful services rendered

by said Cardwell and said Johnson to my dear husband and myself.

I give and bequeath the sum of One Hundred Dollars (\$100.00) in money to Hiles Hollings of Alamance County N.C. absolutely; the sum of Two Hundred Dollars (\$200.00) in money to Henrietta Johnson of Raleigh N.C. absolutely; & the sum of Two Hundred & Fifty Dollars (\$250.00) in money to Dallis Cardwell of Raleigh N.C. absolutely; and the sum of Two Hundred and Fifty Dollars (\$250.00) in money to Mary Cardwell of Raleigh N.C. absolutely.

Item 18

I give and bequeath the sum of Five Hundred Dollars (\$500.00) in money to said Abby Lee Baker in trust for my old house, Lucy Johnson of Burlington N.C. as follows: To invest the same in such manner as he sees fit and during the natural life of said Lucy Johnson, to receive the income from said investments & to pay such income to the said Lucy Johnson during the natural life to be used by her as she sees fit, & at the death of said Lucy Johnson said \$500.00 or the property or estate in which it may have been invested shall go as a part of the residuum of my estate and be disposed of in the manner provided in Item 27 hereof for the disposition of said residuum.

Item 19

I give and bequeath Five Thousand Dollars (\$5000.00) (face value.) of the Bonds of the Virginia Cotton Mills Lawrence County, N.C. now owned by me, to said Abby Lee Baker, to be by him held in trust for the following uses and purposes, to wit:

First the maturity of said bonds to collect the coupons thereon and out of said money to pay off \$100.00 annual of its interest as shall be due and unpaid on the \$5000.00 note dated July 30th 1874 from E.M. Coal of Alamance County N.C. to said Virginia Cotton Mills and the residue of said coupon money to pay to said Court the Executors administrators or assigns; and at the maturity of said bonds to collect the sum total of said Coupons to pay off in full the balance unpaid on said note and the residue of said collections to pay to said Court the Executors Administrators or assigns.

I give and bequeath the sum of one (1) share of preferred stock and the 21 shares of common stock of the Southern Railway Company, and the Four Thousand Dollars (\$4000.00) (face value) of the \$100 per year first mortgage bonds received by me in the

for the sum of Two and Sixteen Thousand Dollars (\$20,000) (face value) of the bonds of the Petersburg, Lynchburg & Columbia Railroad Company, heretofore owned by me, and also Two Thousand Dollars (\$2000.00) face value) of the stock now owned by me in the North Carolina Railroad Company; and also Five Thousand Dollars (\$5000.00) (face value) of the bonds of the Virginia Cotton Mills, Alamance County, N.C., now owned by me, and also the thirty five hundred Dollars (\$3500.00) made from me & applied to me, together with the collector's receipts to said Ashby Lee Baker to be by him held upon the following trusts to wit:

To collect and receive the money paid for the coupons on said bonds and dividends on said stock and also the interest upon said real estate income from said bonds, stock and make up from the investments into which they may have been invested & to pay such coupon, dividends, interest and income money to the Trustees of Wake Forest College & their successors in office, to be used by them in defraying the cost of educating at Wake Forest College young men intending to study for the ministry in the Baptist denomination the beneficiaries themselves to be selected by the faculty of said College.

I give and bequeath the sum of Three Thousand Dollars (\$3,000.00) in money to said Ashby Lee Baker in trust for the benefit of the Baptist Female University of North Carolina as follows: To invest the same in such manner as he deems best and to collect the income from said investments and to pay said income to the said the Baptist Female University of North Carolina to be used for the support and maintenance of said university for the advancement of the purposes objects and work of the same.

I give and bequeath absolutely the sum of Five Hundred Dollars (\$500.00) in money to the Board of Trustees of the Baptist Orphanage, Hornerville to be used for the support & maintenance said Orphanage for the advancement of the purposes objects and work of the same.

I also give and bequeath One Thousand Dollars (\$1,000.00) (face value) of the bonds of

the Virginia Cotton Mills, Alamance County, N.C., now owned by me to said Ashby Lee Baker in trust for the benefit of the Board of Trustees of the Baptist Orphanage, Hornerville as follows: To collect the coupons upon said bonds and at the maturity of said bonds to collect the principal thereof & re-invest said principal in such manner as he sees fit and to collect the income from such investments and to pay said coupon & income money to said the Board of Trustees of the Baptist Orphanage Hornerville, to be used for the support & maintenance of said orphanage for the advancement of the purposes objects and work of the same.

I give and bequeath my two bonds (numbered 19 & 20) of the town of Statesville N.C. each for \$500.00, to the Trustees of the First Baptist Church of Raleigh N.C. in trust for the benefit of the women's missionary society of said Church as follows: To collect the coupons upon said bonds or to sell and convey said bonds & reinvest the proceeds of such sale in such manner as they deem best & to collect the income from said investments and to pay said income & coupon money to said Society to be spent for the advancement of the purposes objects and work of the said Society.

I give and bequeath Two Thousand Dollars (\$2000.00) (face value) of the bonds of the Virginia Cotton Mills Alamance County, N.C., now owned by me, to said Ashby Lee Baker to be by him held upon the following trusts to wit: To collect the coupons upon said bonds and at the maturity of said bonds to collect the principal thereof & re-invest said principal in such manner as he deems best & to collect the income from said investments & to pay said the income from said investments & to pay said coupon and income money to the Trustees of Siler City Baptist Church in Alamance County N.C. & their successors in office to be by them used in keeping said church in repair.

I give and bequeath One Thousand Dollars (\$1000.00) (face value) of the bonds of the Virginia Cotton Mills, Alamance County, N.C., now owned by me to said Ashby Lee Baker to be by him held upon the following trusts to wit: To collect the coupons upon said bonds and at the maturity of said bonds to collect the principal thereof & to reinvest said principal in such manner as he deems best

If at the time of my death there shall not be an amount belonging to my estate, cash money enough to pay the funeral expenses, debts, costs of settling my estate and money legacies hereinafter provided for, then and in that event it is my wish and I do direct that my Executor shall collect or sell any convey, so named of the residuum of my estate, referred to in paragraph 27 hereof, as will be sufficient to produce the money enough to pay off said expenses, debts, costs and legacies in full.

Item 27  
I direct that my executor shall divide into nine (9) equal shares all the rest and residue of the property and estate --- real, personal or mixed, --- of whatsoever nature and wheresoever the same may be (including the remainder after the death of said Lucy Johnson in the \$500.00 or the property into which it may have been converted, referred to in item 18 hereof, and including also the contingent interest in the two and one-half thousand \$3000.00 Virginia Cotton Mills bonds on the property into which they may have been converted referred to in item 6 hereof) belonging to me at the time of my death and not hereinbefore disposed, and which may be left after paying over expenses, debts, costs and money legacies. For the purpose of making said division my Executor is authorized to collect or sell and convey any portion or all of said residuum.

I give devise and bequeath said nine (9) shares as follows: One share to my said sister Mary T. Melone absolutely & in fee simple.

One share to my said sister, Ann E.Y. Horne absolutely and in fee simple.

One share to my said nephews Lt. Brian F. Melone, absolutely and in fee simple.

One (1) share to my said grand-niece Virginia George Melone (now McElroy) absolutely and in fee simple.

One share to my said niece, Nannie G. Neal, absolutely and in fee simple.

Three (3) shares to my Abby Lee Baker in trust for the benefit of the Baptist Female University of North Carolina, as follows: To collect the income from the same or from the investments into which it may be converted and to pay such income to said the Baptist Female University of North Carolina to be used by it the support and maintenance of said University for the advancement of the purposes, objects and work of the same.

One (1) share to said Abby Lee Baker in trust for said J.P. Horneck, Nannie G. Neal, Sallie H. Higgins and their child or children as said Higgins may leave surviving her as follows: To hold use and dispose of the same & the income therefrom & the investments into which it may be converted in the same manner, upon the same terms & for the same uses & purposes as is prescribed in item 7 hereof for holding using & disposing at the death of Ann E.Y. Horneck of the remaining one-third (1/3) of the Bond Stock and Bonds therein referred to for the benefit of said Horneck, Neal, Higgins and her children.

If the said Baker shall survive me but shall be unwilling or unable to carry out the trusts imposed upon her as Trustee in this Will, then and in that event the said Baker may by deed or will duly executed & recorded appoint said person, persons or corporation as he sees fit, as Trustee in his place and stead for the purpose of carrying out said trusts, and for that purpose I direct that the Trustee so appointed shall have (and I do hereby give, devise and bequeath to said Trustee) all the powers, and that said Trustee shall be subject to use the duties and disabilities provided in this Will for said Baker as said Trustee.

Whereas in this Will property or estate is bequeathed or devised to a party or parties in trust such trustee or trustees who may hereafter be appointed in this Will may if they deem it necessary, collect or sell and convey the property or estate so bequeathed or devised in trust, but such trustee shall at once invest the proceeds of such collecting or sales in such

manners as they deem best & the investments so made shall retain the character of the property or estate so collected or kept, and shall be held by such trustee in the same manner & upon the same trusts as the property or estate so collected or kept. And said trustee is expressly authorized before distributing the income from the trust property to pay out of said income all the costs of executing said trust, including tax, etc.

Item 29.

All the debts due by the estate of my late husband, Geo. W. Dinspon have been paid or arranged,

I close omitted from this will certain parties who are near & dear to me. This is done not because I have forgotten them nor yet because they are not dear to me. Nearly all of them are already well provided for in this world's goods, & in making this will it has been my purpose to dispose of my property in a way that it will, as I believe accomplish the most good.

Item 30.

It is my wish that I be buried by the side of my dear husband, in my burial lot in Pleasant Cemetery, near Raleigh N.C. It is my further wish that on the same day and just below my husband's inscription, upon the monument on said lot, there shall be engraved the words, "This beloved and devoted wife, Virginia Bertlett Yancey, born in Caswell County, N.C. November 2nd 1826. Died in [unclear] [unclear] place and date of death). I wish engraved upon the side of the monument, opposite the one above referred to, the words: "Married by the Rev. John S. Pritchard of the Baptist Denomination, at Caswell in Caswell Co., N.C. Nov. 23d 1842." The words: "Trusting in Jesus for salvation, Engraved upon said monument apply to both my husband and myself, and I wish no other words engraved upon said monument.

Item 31.

I hereby expressly revoke all other wills & statements hereinafter made by me, & declare this to be my last will and testament.

Codicil, to the Last Will and Testament of one, Virginia  
B. Y. Dinspon thereto annexed and added bears date  
August 4th, 1897.

Whereas, by my Last Will and Testament I have made sundry bequests & devises to my sister Ann E.Y. Monnett and whereas since the making of said Last Will and Testament the said Ann E.Y. Monnett has died. Now therefore:

I hereby revoke the bequest and devise to Ann E.Y. Monnett contained in item 27 of said Last Will and Testament of one share ( $\frac{1}{2}$ ) of the residue of my estate, and do hereby give devise & bequeath the said one share ( $\frac{1}{2}$ ) of said residue absolute by and in fee simple to my nephew James R. Monnett, but it is my wish that out of the same he shall as long as he lives keep in repair and good condition the old Bertlett Yancey family grave yard on the old Bertlett Yancey Home Place situated about two miles from Yanceyville in Caswell County, N.C. in which place he now resides, and said bequest & devise is hereby charged with keeping said grave yard in repair and condition as aforesaid.

And in all other respects except as charged by this Codicil I do hereby ratify and confirm my Last Will and Testament of which this Codicil is hereby declared to be a part.
