 to sell, convey or otherwise dispose of, mortgage
 or otherwise encumber, any or all of my
 estate, either publicly or privately, as she may
 deem, without the order or sanction of
 any Court or person whatever, she is
 fully and well advised of the necessity of making an
 inventory and of having an appraisement
 made of my estate, and of making any
 annual or better returns to any Court or
 person whatever.
