is to provide for her out of said estate a com-
fortable support during her natural life with
a decent burial at her death.

Testament,

In witness whereof, I have hereunto subscribed my name, and affixed my seal, the 19th day of January, in the year of our Lord, one thousand eight hundred and fifty eight: hereby resigning my body to the dust and my spirit to God who gave it.
