of February one thousand seven Hundred and thirty
one I Benjamin warmack being very sick and
weak in body but of perfect mind and memory thanks
be to almighty God for the same and knowing the mor-
tality of my body and knowing that is appointed
for all men once to die Do make and ordain this my
last will and Testament that is to say I give and
recommend my soul to the hands of God that give
it my body I recommend to the earth to be buried
decent Christian burial at the discretion of my
Executors nothing Doubting but at the general Resurrec-
tion I shall receive the same again by the mighty power of
God and touching such worldly Estate where with
God pleased God to bless me in this life I give and
dispose of the same in following manner and form
First I give and my dearly beloved wife Anne
my plantation stock and negroes I give
my house and lot to Anne but she to have the same
or her heirs I give to my son John one hundred acres
of land lying between my two plantations I give
my son all my land above the road on the
South side of a creek I give not meddling with the land
belonging to him on which I now live I give unto
William my son after my wife's time in it my dwelling house
on with all the land belonging to the same on the north
side of a creek my plantation and mill Down the
creek I leave to be sold to pay my Debts I give
Benjamin my son two negroes Cherry and one that fills
goes with I give to my Daughter Lucies I give
I give Leah my Daughter one negro named
Rachel I give to Sarah my Daughter one negro
named mourning I give to my son Jacob I give
Each of them one negro named Moses to Jacob and
to William I give my son John one negro named Jim
Turn over

and give to my Brother in Law with my
son Wyly to be my sole Executors of this my
Last will and Testament ratifying and
confirming this and no other to be my last
Will and Testament for witness whereof I have
hereunto set my hand and affixed my seal
this 18th Day of February 1731
