I Edward Robinson of the County of Cumberland and State of North Carolina being Sane of Law and Mind in body but in perfect mind & memory calling into mind the Mortality of man's body knowing that it is appointed for all men once to die do make and Ordain this my last Will and Testament where as I give Dispose & dispose of my Property in the following manner and form that is to say I Give to my Wife Elisabeth Robinson one Black mare one Bed and furniture one chise one flat Wheel & wooden wheel & one fourth part of all my Household furniture Stock corn & working Tools and also I Give her one Negro man & heron ~~part of~~ so long as she lives in Cumberland County & said Negro m^t to be moved out of said County & if she Removes out of said County for him to be Return in Equal division to my four children

I Give to my Son Lewis Robinson Two Hundred & fifty acres of land Lying on the waters of the Spring Branch and the fourth part of all my Negroes

I Give to my Son Nicholas Robinson one Yoke of Oxen and the fourth part of all my Negroes

I Give to my daughter Susanah Robinson one bed & furniture & the fourth part of all my household furniture Stock of all kind corn & working Tools & the fourth part of all my Negroes

I Give to my daughter Dorey Robinson one Bed & furniture & all the Serpless feathers one & the fourth part of all my Household furniture Stock of all kind corn & working tools & the fourth part of all my Negroes

I Give to my sister Elisabeth Robinson the fourth part of all my Household furniture Stock of all kind corn & working Tools & one coat of name Buck

I John Robinson Sen^r of the State of North Carolina
and County of Cumberland being low and weak in
Body tho^o a sound and perfect mind and memory
do make and ordain this my last Will and Testament
in the following form and manner

I give unto my Wife Susannah Robinson all
my whole Estate both Real and Personal Consist-
ing of One hundred Acres of Land including
The houses and plantation whereon I now
dwell and all my Stock of Cattle Hogs and
Sheep and all my house hold goods and furniture
and all my working tools all which premises
I give my said Wife for and during her Natural
Life

I give to my Son Joel Robinson Twenty Shilling
in Bar of any further portion of me
I give to my Son John Robinson Twenty Shillings
in Bar of any further portion of me
I give to my Daughter Sarah Gilley and to her
Heir and assigns forever One hundred Acres

of Land whereon she now dwelle
and y^e the residue of my said Wife
I desire that all the premises that I have
given to her during her Natural life may
be Equally divided between my two Daughters
Mary Robinson and Susannah Baker

And I do hereby Nominate and appoint my two
afore said Daughters Mary and Susannah
my whole and Sole Executors of this my last
Will and Testament In Witnes^s whereof
I the said John Robinson doth hereunto set my
hand and Seal this 21st Day of Jan^y 1790
