

In the name of God, Amen, I Elizabeth Westbrooke of the Town of Fayetteville in the State of North Carolina, being of sound and perfect mind and memory, do this eighth day of December, in the year of our Lord 1820 - make & publish this my last will & testament, hereby revoking all former wills by me made - in manner following; that is to say,

First, I give and bequeath to my daughter Elizabeth Ann Westbrooke, the House & Lot on Person Street where I now live, except so much of the front of said Lot as is occupied by a house now building by my son-in-law, Moses Hubbard, viz: eleven feet front by nineteen feet deep -

I also give & bequeath to my said daughter Elizabeth Ann Westbrooke, all my personal property of every description, after the payment of my just debts -

Secondly, I give & bequeath to my daughter, Ann Hubbard so much of the Lot on which I now live as has been excepted above from the devise to my daughter Elizabeth Ann Westbrooke, viz: eleven feet front on Person Street extending back nineteen feet to the dwelling house, bounded eastwardly by an alley which divides this

I also leave two four year old slaves in the value of \$1000 in money to defray the charges of my funeral -
