this my last will and Testament.

In the first place I will and devise to my wife

which I may possess at my death, to wit, the house

Street my present residence, one lot on Mylers
Street and the half of a lot of ground on North
Street owned jointly by me and Mathew Henry
2ndly I will and bequeath to my wife Hannah all my
personal property during her life time, to wit,
two coloured Children Slaves viz. Mary now in
my possession and Henry in the possession of
Wesley Hanks in Chatham County, my household
and kitchen furniture all my undivided half of
the goods in the saddler shop now conducted under
the firm of George W. Raglen & Co. & half of the
Building which the Saddler shop is kept in, also
all monies bonds notes accounts & all other evidences
of debt due me, subject however to the payment
of all my just debts and the herein after men-
tioned legacies, but at my wife Hannah's death
all the property real and the personal that
may be remaining then is to go to

Hanak All King on the conditions that should she get married that she is to have the property settled on her by a marriage settlement but should she neglect to have the property settled on her & her heirs by marriage settlement, after her marriage the property is to go to my two sisters Charles Huntington & William, otherwise to remain Hanak & her heirs forever

3^d I will & bequeath one hundred dollars to Benjamin Jackson to be paid to him by my Executor or administrator

4th I will and bequeath one hundred dollars to
Rachell Ann Arey to be paid to her or her representative
by my Executor or administrator

5th It is my will wish & desire that Hannah McHarg
will live with my wife Hannah as one of her
family and be supported out of my Estate
